Ultimately these experiments are very loving, and the outcomes are redemptive—even when Conley's sassy kids show him the limits of his profession. Parentology teaches you everything you need to know about the latest literature

on parenting—with lessons that go down easy. You'll be laughing and learning at the same time.
