Morty is looking for a house. But it's not easy. "This is NOT the place for me!" says Morty. What will Morty do?

I must begin my latest venture into the world of the November Book Challenge with a brief explanation of what brought me here. The serpentine route I took to get my Point A to Point B is mapped with good intentions, a love of music, and my dedication to my family, to my career, and to my Al-Anon program. Sirius Radio has been my saving grace. The first three things I do when I get into the car are fasten my seat belt, turn on the ignition, and turn on the radio. Those three simple tasks get my day started, and they provide me with the impetus to do what I choose to do each and every day. The channels I listen to provide me with inspiration and words of encouragement; The Message, The Blend, The Broadway Channel, Love, and Joel Osteen Radio are my companions on the road to and from school and home. While I was contemplating the subject of my fifth book, I realized that I could kill two birds with one stone. I have been the District Representative for District 26 in Al-Anon for the past six years, and part of my position has asked me to do service and provide a message of recovery for anyone interested in hearing about my experience, strength, and hope. The twelfth step in Al-Anon explains that as part of having a spiritual awakening, I should spread this message and incorporate it into all aspects of my daily life. Here was the quandary. How could I talk about Al-Anon and make the connection to what I listen to on Sirius Radio on a daily basis? That formed the premise of my current project and enabled me to take this journey of self-

discovery for myself and for anyone else interested in this proposal. The rest of this book breaks down the process in several ways. I have included the song lyrics with the title. Then I have analyzed the song on a number of levels to provide you, the reader, with my interpretation of the song's message and how it dovetails with the basic message of Al-Anon. My disclaimer at this point is that this is not CAL (Conference Approved Literature), but simply my own humble interpretation of the words contained herein. If I offend anyone with my take on the songs and the connection, I apologize here and now. As you read the song lyrics and interpret the meanings for yourself, realize where I was coming from as I presented my own thoughts and views of the material. In the Al-Anon program, we stress the fact that this recovery program is a spiritual philosophy, not a religious mantra. A number of the songs refer to God, but anyone can have a Higher Power to turn to in his or her time of need. I also have morphed my feelings toward the messages contained in this volume into a vision that melds a Higher Power and the people in the program into a unified support system. Therefore, you may see that when I discuss the individual songs, I could be reaching out or appealing to more than one possible source of help. I have also included profiles of the contributors in this volume. These short biographical excerpts are taken from Wikipedia, which is only one place to find background information on these artists and their songs, music, and messages. My third section provides the reader with a discography of the songs and where they can be located on Sirius Radio. While there are hundreds of channels available on this service, I only used the ones I listen to on my radio or computer. Feel free to explore the entire Sirius Radio network at your leisure. Are you ready to begin this musical journey? I hope you enjoy yourself, and if you bring away any message that helps make your life a better one, then I will have done what I intended to do from the beginning.

You've finally reached the pivotal moment in your life to get clean and sober. I welcome you to join me as I share my quest for addiction recovery and sobriety. This book is hopeful and encouraging. It is a must read for the fellow addict that deserves a new chapter in life. I wrote this book with the burning desire and a passion for reaching out to fellow addicts as a resource for them to possibly utilize some of my experiences and methods for recovery and relapse prevention. The book encompasses my life journey from my early teen years into adulthood as an addict, which details some of the painful aspects that encouraged me to turn to substance abuse as a coping mechanism. This book also alludes to my experience with the recovery process which I share many of the self-researched and time-tested techniques that helped me cultivate my successful rehabilitation process. Addiction exerts a long and powerful influence on the brain that manifests in three distinct ways: craving for the object of addiction, loss of control over its use, and continuing involvement with it despite adverse consequences. While overcoming addiction is possible, the process is often long, slow, and complicated. The word "addiction" is derived from a Latin term for "enslaved by" or "bound to." Anyone who has struggled to overcome an addiction - or has tried to help someone else to do so - understands why, and ultimately, we can understand that addiction is a "dis-ease". From my experience, addiction is also a disease of isolation. The question of whether addiction is a disease or not has perplexed clinicians and scholars and researchers for decades. At one point, addiction was easily called the disease. At other points in time, there was considerable debate about how to classify these phenomena. I think it's best to talk about the disease of addiction. The word "addiction" is derived from a Latin term for "enslaved by" or "bound to." At one point, addiction was easily called the disease. At other points in time, there was considerable debate about how to classify these phenomena. I think it's best to talk about the disease of addiction. My story is like so many others who chose to foolishly abuse alcohol and drugs...most of us were unaware that we had these addictions that are conveniently labeled as a "disease." However, the fact is that each one of us is a unique individual with our own story to tell. Usually, the suffering alcoholic/ addict hits a point called "rock bottom" in their lives where they choose to get better or turn for the worse. When this happens, life-changing events usually transpire to test the person's character and integrity. Hitting "rock bottom" was my personal alarm clock for realizing I had a serious substance abuse problem. There was a defining moment in my life that turned a page, sending me in a new direction. Making the transition from being actively addicted to being in recovery is a complex physical and psychological process. There is a lot to learn in recovery and we have to make a lot of changes internally and externally. Writing this book has given me a wholesome and hopeful perspective on life and the world we live in. I find that I spend more time embraced in bold prayer and meditation which grants me the influence to believe in miracles for others. I trust that there are great people in this world that contribute to making a significant difference, consequently making the world a better place for all of us to live in. Composing this book was my contribution to 'pay it forward' in a positive way. I am honored.

Just Give Me a Soft Place to Land When three women, Beth, Caroline and Sarah agree to meet on Wednesday night to share their passion for knitting, they had no idea their group would grow to number eleven over the years. Nor did they realize as the women knit, they had common concerns despite their varied journeys. Each begins to share her struggles, failures and triumphs creating the core of a deep seeded bond amongst them. Beth will share a teenage pregnancy resulting in guilt and shame which have haunted her for years before culminating in the discovery of the child; now a grown man. The women support her as she meets the father of her child forty years later. Caroline discovers, within months after her marriage, her husband has a problem, diagnosed as alcoholism but which she believes is rooted in psychological trauma. After fearing for her life, the women support Caroline as she lets go of a toxic marriage and experiences the pain of co-dependency. Sarah is devastated when her soul mate dies suddenly and later, after marrying a man who promises to take care of her, smothers her instead with his need to be needed. The women encourage Sarah to find her voice and convince her husband he needs to let her succeed or fail so she can build a sense of self-worth. Cindy's husband is diagnosed with cancer while Kelly's mother sends a letter telling her to 'have a good life'. The book is filled with heartache but humor as the women laugh over commonalities in their marriages. The story is character-driven with strong voices eliciting palpable emotion, drawing the reader into empathizing with the character. Each woman's story creates an arc leaving the reader anxious to return and learn what happens next. The concept of the knitting group provides an ideal backdrop for the setting. Each woman opens topics relative to all women and which become perfect fodder for book club discussion. The women will laugh and cry together, each woman acknowledges their group has become a soft place to land.

From advance planning to advice on bridging the return from the twenty-four week retreat to everyday life, this Director's Guide provides assistance to those organizing Ignatian retreats based on James W. Skehan's Place Me with Your Son and those wishing to deepen the previous retreat experience. This volume explains the foundations of each phase of the retreat and suggests ways to prepare for the transitions between the phases. Skehan reviews the basic concepts; anticipates problems and opportunities that may arise in each week; offers possible responses to exercitants' questions; and interprets Scriptural passages for modern readers. The Guide also includes a list of recommended supplemental readings and guidelines for integrating the retreat into the liturgical year.

The book *Is there a place for me in the Church?* is collection of interviews and essays of the persons who were, or still are, members of the Church or a Christian community, but for various reasons felt distanced or marginalized within Her. The book is result of the first project of Echoes Network, that is a part of a broader research agenda summarized under the title *Echoes from the Church in Central and Eastern Europe*. In total 47 personal testimonies (15 essays and 32 interviews) are published in this book. They are collected in 12 countries of Central and Eastern Europe: Belarus, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Croatia, Czech Republic, Hungary, Latvia, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, and Ukraine.
