Chesterton's first novel is set in London in 1984, eighty years in the future, where political indifference has swept over the land, and a new King jokingly decrees a revival of medieval heraldry throughout London. The ruse is taken seriously by the title character, Adam Wayne, who aims to fight to the finish to defend Notting Hill. At once humorous and absorbing, it is a fine example of Chesterton's first-rate storytelling.

This novel interweaves Renaissance artist Piero di Cosimo's fifteenth-century viewpoint with the twenty-first-century reality of two young Canadian students: Agnes Vane, an art history major fascinated by di Cosimo's multi-layered imagery, and Peter (Pinto) Dervaiq, a student of philosophy passionate about preventing cruelty to animals. Both Agnes and Pinto were marginalized in their adolescence because of their unusual appearance. Agnes has slightly simian features. Pinto is a huge man with a multihued skin pigmentation. When Agnes, as a lonely and alienated child, discovers di Cosimo's empathetic paintings of animals and human-animal hybrids, she feels she is looked upon gently for the first time in her life. That moment influences her decision to become an animal rights activist, a commitment that ultimately brings her both anguish and insight. Her story is echoed by chapters from di Cosimo's perspective as he pits his solitary vision, of a golden age when animals did indeed speak, against the dictatorial grip in which Savonarola, destroyer of secular art and culture, holds the city of Florence. Hunting Piero is the tale of a passionate moral quest, and equally, a story of redemption and of love tested by tragic missteps and their deadly consequences

A Baby For The Village Doctor

This book investigates adaptations of The Lady of Shalott and Elaine of Astolat in Victorian and post-Victorian popular culture to explore their engagement with medievalism, social constructions of gender, and representations of the role of art in society. Although the figure of Elaine first appeared in medieval texts, including Malory’s Le Morte Darthur, Tennyson’s poems about the Lady and Elaine drew unprecedented response from musicians, artists, and other authors, whose adaptations in some cases inspired further adaptations. With chapters on music, art, and literature (including parody, young people’s literature, and historical fiction and fantasy), this book seeks to trace the evolution of these characters and the ways in which they reinforce or challenge conventional gender roles, represent the present’s relationship to the past, and highlight the power of art.

The CKCU Ottawa Folk Festival began in 1994 to showcase Canada's folk traditions through music, dance, storytelling, and crafts. The festival was co-founded by CKCU station manager Max Wallace, and performing songwriter Chris White. The event became known for its relaxed atmosphere, enthusiastic grassroots following, and loyal volunteer contingent. By 2007 it became known as simply the Ottawa Folk Festival. In 2010, the Ottawa Folk Festival came under new leadership with executive director Mark Monahan and was rebranded in 2013 as CityFolk. The festival's first publicist, Joyce MacPhee, wrote a historical account of the festival each year capturing not just the performances, but the ambiance. She was aided in her efforts by many festival volunteers. This book covers the first 19 years of the festival as it evolved from a one-day festival on Victoria Island to a beloved four-day community event held at Britannia Park to a reimagined festival at Hogs Back Park. A concerted effort was made to document the festival in images from the outset. Each year that film was used (1994 to 2005), the photos were edited down to small sets showing the performers, volunteers, and patrons interacting to create a folk festival experience. These sets were displayed on photo boards. From 2006 to 2012 digital images were taken. This book combines the history text with photos and adds some additional text to bring the Ottawa Folk Festival into the context of the 25th-anniversary celebration in 2018.
