The 2022 coins recognize the achievements of Maya Angelou, Dr. Sally Ride, Wilma Mankiller, Nina Otero-Warren, and Anna May Wong.

The State Quarter program has made coin collecting cool. To do its part in the war effort, the U.S. Mint changed from a copper cent to a zinc-coated steel version for one year, in 1943. Larger in size than the average folder, this unit has room for 144 coins, the most of any similar folder.
