Mac Garaidh Mhar (a Celtic title). In 1727 she nominated John Duke of Roxburgh, to be Her Deputy and walk in the procession for the coronation of George II. In 1745 she raised an army of Buchan men who stood for "Bonnie Prince Charlie"-Prince Charles Edward Stuart. She was close to sixty years of age at the time. At this time, Mary was a practicing Episcopalian and as this faith was persecuted by the Hanoverians she fitted out a grange as a place of worship. This was known in Cruden Bay as 'Countess Mary's Giral'. It was burnt to the ground in 1746 by English Dragoons. She succeeded her brother, Charles and was succeeded by grandnephew Lord James Boyd Kilmarnock, the grandson of her sister Margaret.
