Technology and increasing levels of education have exposed people to more information than ever before. These societal gains, however, helped fuel a surge in narcissistic and misguided intellectual egalitarianism that has crippled informed debates on any number of issues. All voices, even the most ridiculous, demand to be taken with equal seriousness, and any claim to be dismissed as undemocratic elitism. Tom Nichols' *The Death of Expertise* shows how this rejection of experts has occurred: the openness to the emergence of a customer satisfaction model in higher education, and the transformation of the news industry into a 24-hour entertainment machine, among other reasons. Paradoxically, the increasingly democratic dissemination of information, rather than producing an educated citizenry, has instead created an army of ill-informed and angry citizens who denounce intellectual achievement. When ordinary citizens believe they know more than anyone else, democratic institutions themselves are in danger of falling either to populism or to technocracy or, in the combination of both.
