nine months,  
and before  
dying, will lay**

400 to 500 eggs  
during her  
lifetime, and  
primarily on  
only one type of  
milkweed plant,  
but only a small  
percentage of**

offspring of the  
first generation  
travel on to  
Kansas and  
Tennessee  
during April  
where the  
female will**

eggs and die,

continues to

Iowa and  
Wisconsin in  
May and the  
Great Lakes and**
