Clark's controversial work is discussed in the book, but is also fundamental to the book's advocacy for distance education - in other words, we authors did not make the claim that education delivered at a distance was inherently better than other ways people learn.**

**Distance delivered instruction is not a “magical” approach that makes learners achieve more. The fourth theme of the book is equivalency theory.
