The Protestant Bible includes 66 books; 39 books in the Old Testament, 27 books in the New Testament. The people who wrote the Bible were not etheral saints playing harps and doing good deeds; they were flesh and blood men and women who struggled against temptation, fear, and doubt as they understood the nature of God grew deeper. When we read the Bible, it's important to recognize ourselves in these early followers of the faith, because it's through their human nature that we have come to know God.
