

## Bid Document Punjab Government Tenders

*The Government of Pakistan strongly supports public-private partnership (PPP) initiatives. From 1990 to 2019, Pakistan witnessed 108 financially closed PPP projects, with a total investment of approximately \$28.4 billion. About 88% of these projects are in the energy sector, attracting more than \$24.7 billion, followed by investments in the port sector. In early 2021, Parliament approved the amendments to the 2017 PPP Law, enacting the Public Private Partnership Authority (Amendment) Act 2021. This further strengthens the enabling legal and regulatory framework for developing and implementing PPPs, thereby promoting private sector investment in public infrastructure and related services.*

These Standard Prequalification Documents serve as a guide for those wanting to prequalify to bid on large contracts for projects financed by the World Bank. Qualifying as a bidder is separate from the bid evaluation process. Before invitations to bid on large or especially complex works projects are issued, a process of prequalification is required to select competent bidders. This document helps bidders through the prequalification process. To simplify presentation by applicants for prequalification, standard forms have been prepared for the submission of relevant information. Guidance notes and examples are provided for the implementing agency making the evaluation. Annexes give information about prequalification that are likely to be of interest to potential bidders on World Bank projects.
