the politics of incarceration in Caribbean societies under U.S. influence. It is a comparative social, cultural, and political history of convicts and the different communities with which they interacted. I use penitentiaries to understand the intricate knowledge and experiences shaping the consolidation of two polities and societies in the twentieth century: the Insular Penitentiary (Oso Blanco) and colonial democracy in Puerto Rico, and the Nigua penitentiary and dictatorship in the Dominican Republic. Rather than focus exclusively on modernization, criminology, and the customary orders of penitentiaries, however, I emphasize convict intellectuals, how the prison afforded them opportunities to refine their political voice, and how their volition positioned them to negotiate state conditioning. My findings challenge scholars to transcend the biopolitics of prisons by bringing to light the common aspects of "irreconcilable" forms of knowledge and experience. This signals a shift away from narratives that underscore the raw hegemony of incarceration, the magnification of difference, and the failures of rehabilitation. Instead, I trace the medico-religious and humanistic routines of prison life, and the uneven yet profound links between convicts, communities, and political systems. Using a range of archival, library, and other (un)published materials, I argue that despite historical and political differences in Puerto Rico and the Dominican Republic, science and spirituality were powerful tools of redemptive practice. By redemptive practice I mean (im)material approaches to (un)freedom, citizen-making, and community formation. In both societies, science and spirituality helped produce "awakened" citizens on the one hand and perpetual citizenship deficits on the other. These "ways of knowing" diverged in terms of content, but shared the scaffolding of performance. As experiential reformatory enterprises, Caribbean penitentiaries and their cultures of care inspired the correctional imagination behind and beyond bars. They formed part of a constellation of redemptive practices that spanned medical and social science, orthodox and heterodox religiosities, the broader humanities, and executive clemency.

**I have long wished to write a novel, but I could not determine what it was to be about. I could not bear any thing common-place, and I did not know what to do for a hero. Heroes are generally so much alike, so monotonous, so dreadfully insipid—so completely brothers of one race,**

with the family likeness so amazingly strong—"This will not do for me," thought I as I sauntered listlessly down a shady lane, one fine evening in June; "I must have something new, something quite out of the beaten path:—but what?"—ay, that was the question. In vain did I rack my brains—in vain did I search the storehouse of my memory: I could think of nothing that had not been thought of before. This book examines the nexus between the corporeal, emotional, spiritual and intellectual aspects of human life as represented in the writing of the Middle Ages and the Renaissance. Authors from different fields examine not only the question of the body and soul (or body and mind) but also how this question fits into a broader framework in the medieval and early modern period. Concepts such as gender and society, morality, sexuality, theological precepts and medical knowledge are a part of this broader framework. This discussion of ideas draws from over two thousand years of Western thought: from Plato in the fifth century BC and the fourth century Byzantine dialogues on the soul, to the philosophical and medical writings of the early 1700s. There are four sections to this book: each section is based on where the authors have found a conjunction between the body and mind/soul. The work begins with a

**section on text and self-perception, which focuses on creative output from the period. The second conjunction is human emotions which are described in their social contexts. The third is sex, where the human body and mind are traditionally believed to meet. The fourth section, Material Souls, engages with bodies and other material aspects of existence perceived, studied or utilised as material signs of emotional and spiritual activity.**

**At the turn of the twenty-first century Britain is in a state of change. It is being transformed by the ongoing process of devolution as well as by its increasing multi-ethnicity. At the same time the relationship with the European Union remains controversial. This book charts these transformations in the context of the changes Britain experienced a century ago, at the turn of the twentieth century. *Evagrius of Pontus and Gregory of Nyssa have either been overlooked by philosophers and theologians in modern times, or overshadowed by their prominent friend and brother (respectively), Gregory Nazianzus and Basil the Great. This book provides a critical evaluation of their thought on these major issues and argues that in Evagrius and Gregory we see the important integration of many different concerns that later Christian thought was not always able to balance including: mysticism, asceticism, cognitive science, philosophy, and theology.*

*The book explores the relationship between Christology and theological anthropology through the lens provided by the theology of Karl Barth and the mind/body discussion in contemporary philosophy of mind. It thus comprises two major sections.
