Finally, the book offers radical solutions to make science work in the public interest and provide food that really is safe to eat.

This paper characterizes consumer demand for food safety and the dynamic impact of a social marketing campaign to promote a tested, third party verified maize flour in Kenya, where dietary exposure to the fungal toxin aflatoxin is a major public health concern. Consumption of high levels of aflatoxin can be fatal, but this is relatively rare. Of greater concern is chronic exposure, which has been linked in numerous studies to liver cancer and may also contribute to child stunting. A significant proportion of the maize consumed in Kenya, where it is the primary dietary staple, fails to meet regulatory standards. One study reported widely in the Kenyan press found that 65% of maize samples collected from 20 major millers did not meet the national standard (Gathura, 2011) and another based on over 900 samples collected from retailers found that 26% of branded maize flour was above this standard (Hoffmann and Moser, 2017).

The Environment, Food and Rural Affairs Committee warns that vaccination against bovine TB is expensive, offers no guarantee of protection and will provide little benefit in the immediate future. More than £58 million has been invested in vaccine research and development since 1994. Deployment of the injectable badger vaccine will cost an estimated £2,000-£4,000 per km2. The cattle vaccine is expected to cost £5-6 per dose and the DIVA test (which differentiates between infected and vaccinated cattle) costs £25. Small-scale studies to test the efficacy of the vaccine in cattle overseas have shown the protective effect to be between 56-68%, a level of protection that won't immediately solve the problems of bovine TB in the cattle industry. The UK needs more reliable skin tests than the current one that could miss one in four infected cows. An injectable BCG vaccine for badgers is now available but it does not confer complete protection and has no discernible effect on animals already infected with TB. An oral baited vaccine that can be laid at setts is likely to be cheaper and more practical, but development and deployment of it will take several years to resolve. A variety of ongoing research projects could make a real difference to the eradication of bovine TB in the United Kingdom. These include: PCR testing to determine infected badger setts, a new type of test to identify bovine TB in cattle after slaughter, and work on a vaccine that does not interfere with the skin test.

Testing the Existence of Herd Instinct

Being a social creature, the herd instinct pushes individuals to imitate and ape the mental actions of surroundings. Similarly, the investors gravitate themselves with the behavioral pattern of evions which instigates the herding behavior. The research piece of work is exploring the prominent herding behavior amongst the 13 sectoral indices of Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE), starting from the period of January 2006 to December 2013. The abnormal returns of BSE sectoral indices have been calculated and the methodology of CH (1995) and CHK (2000) is being used for evidencing the existence or non-existence of herding behavior in BSE sectoral indices. The paper is an attempt to come across the herding behavior in bull and bear phases. To test the presence of herd instinct, a linear regression model has been applied. The result of the paper is endorsing the fact about BSE sectoral indices' efficiency or inefficiency as some of the sectors are significantly evidenced with the notion of herd instinct existence.
