EVIDENCE IN TRAFFIC CRASH INVESTIGATION AND RECONSTRUCTION begins with a detailed description of the entire investigation process. The manual also discusses the importance of calling upon the skills and advice of occupational specialists, such as reconstructionists, lawyers, traffic engineers, pathologists, medical examiners and others, to assist in the investigation and reconstruction of a crash that will ensure that the objectives of a thorough and complete investigation will be satisfied. Considerable effort has been made in the manual to explain how to identify, interpret and analyze all forms of highway marks and damages that can be used in the reconstruction of a vehicle-related crash. As a guide for investigators, prosecutors and defense attorneys, checkboxes are provided with many of the major topics that can be used as prompts in evaluating the thoroughness of an investigation or for those areas that might or might not need additional coverage at trial or litigation proceedings. To meet international requirements, mathematical references are described in both English (U.S.) and SI (metric) measurement systems, accompanied by various appendices covering symbols and mathematical conversions. Finally, there is a comprehensive quick-find index that takes the reader directly to any topic, formulae, or subject matter - or any combination of these.

Two murders, no suspects, zero clues On April 14, 2013, police in Davis, California, received a call to check on Oliver "Chip" Northup, 87, an attorney and bluegrass musician. The singer and guitarist had failed to show up for two gigs, and that was not like him. Chip was not answering his phone and neither was his wife Claudia Maupin, 76, an actress and pastoral associate. Police found a cut screen over an open window. Inside they found Chip and Claudia stabbed, mutilated and eviscerated. It was the first murder in several years in Davis, a low-crime college town near Sacramento. Local police had never seen an attack of such savagery. The killer or killers left no clues. Detectives logged thousands of hours, chased down leads as far as Nevada, served 35 search warrants and generated 218 police reports.

The FBI joined the search but by mid-June of 2013 these marathon efforts rendered no suspects and police remained without a clue. Then police got a telephone call that led them to an address a stone's throw from the cemetery where murder victims Chip and Claudia lay in their final rest. There police picked up a high-school student, 16 years of age, and brought him to the station. As it turned out, he knew details only someone at the crime scene could know. And as the police learned, he had a lot to say for himself.

Agricultural workers face greater threats from pesticide-related illnesses -- including acute poisonings and long-term effects such as cancer and birth defects -- than any other sector of society. "Death on the 'Twilight Zone' Set" Los Angeles Herald Examiner, July 24, 1982 "Flying debris from exploding gasoline fireballs triggered yesterday's freak helicopter crash that killed veteran actor Vic Morrow and two child actors as they filmed an escape scene, preliminary reports from investigators indicate." May 29th, 1987 - The jury in the Twilight Zone accident case acquit movie director John Landis and four co-defendants of all charges filed by the LA District Attorney. Among the jurors' conclusions were that the Vietnam era helicopter was accidentally sent spinning out of control during filming by poorly timed special effects explosions. In Northwest Texas, a small town shoeshine boy looks to the blue skies above Sundown and yearns to be a pilot. Ten years pass and Dorcey Wingo is drafted as part of LBJ's massive military build-up in Vietnam. In March of 1969, "Charlie" Model gunship pilot Wingo takes to the skies over Pleiku in the defense of freedom. The author survives his tour of duty, returning to a shattered marriage, and an ungrateful and divided America. In time, his love of flying takes him as far afield as the jungles of Peru and the poppy fields of Mexico. Then came the movies, and the Twilight Zone. Southern California has been Wingo's home base for many years of his aerial adventures, culminating as a Huey logging pilot in the Northwestern USA and Alaska. "Captain Methane" put Wind Loggers into print in 2005, the first such book about the hazardous helicopter logging profession.

A major biography—intimate, gripping, revelatory—of an artist who revolutionized American comedy. Richard Pryor may have been the most unlikely star in Hollywood history.
