They are just trying to navigate a networked world. Behind Their Screens, Emily Weinstein and Carrie James, Harvard researchers who are leading experts on teens and technology, explore the complexities that teens face in their daily lives, and suggest that many adult efforts to help—"Get off your phone!" "Just don't sext!"—fall short. Weinstein and James warn against a single-minded focus by adults on "screen time." Teens worry about dependence on their devices, but disconnecting from them is being out of the loop socially, with absence perceived as rudeness or even a failure. There is a support group there for a struggling friend. Drawing on a multiyear project that surveyed more than 3,500 teens, the authors explain that young people need empathy, not exasperation or sarcasm. Rolling.
