Hidden far from sight, deep in the thick underbrush of the North Florida woods are the ghost graves of more than thirty unidentified bodies, some of which are thought to be children who were beaten to death at the old Florida Industrial School for Boys at Marianna. It explores how the past shapes the present, how difficult it can be to change patterns of

behavior, and how sometimes, learning your lesson might come just a little too late. Sixteen-year-olds Mark and Bryon have been like brothers since childhood, but now, as their involvement with girls, gangs, and drugs increases, their relationship seems to gradually disintegrate.

But the big canine who Travis calls "Old Yeller" proves his worth by defending the family from danger. And Travis ultimately finds help and comfort in the courage and unwavering love of the dog who comes to be his very best friend. Fred Gipson's novel is an eloquently simple story that is both exciting and deeply moving. It stands alongside works like *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, *Where The Red Fern Grows*, and *Shiloh* as a beloved and enduring classic of literature. Originally published in 1956 to instant acclaim, *Old Yeller* later inspired a hit film from Walt Disney. Just as *Old Yeller* inevitably makes his way into the Coates family's hearts, this book will find its own special place in readers' hearts.
