Distilled to its bare essentials communication involves a sender transmitting an idea, information, or feeling to a receiver who is able to understand what has been communicated. Effective communication thus occurs only when the receiver understands the exact information or idea that the sender intended to convey. Thus communication as a discipline seeks to understand the impact of messages on human behavior and in the context of this paper emphasis is human behavior within an organizational setting. Communication as a discipline includes the study of

communication in interpersonal relationships, groups and organizations.
