María Elena Walsh, poeta, traductora, libretista, compositora, cantante y actriz, se constituye en la década del 60 como primera escritora argentina moderna con destinatario infantil. Consideramos la totalidad de su obra como un texto que se mantiene vigente a través de generaciones en la cultura argentina, generando nuevos sentidos por medio de sus relecturas permanentes. El impacto de su legado poético se transformó con el tiempo en un arma cargada de futuro –al decir de Gabriel Celaya– un arma poética para defender y acompañar a los chicos con una poesía que es, en definitiva, un canto a la libertad. Este ensayo ha sido distinguido en 2018 con la Faja de Honor de la Sociedad Argentina de Escritores y la Sociedad de Escritores de la Provincia de Buenos Aires lo premió con la Faja de Honor 2017–2018 en la categoría Ensayo como Semifinalista.

Glaxo is a chilling novel of betrayal, romance, and murder, from a major Latin American writer being published in English for the first time. In a derelict town in Argentina's pampa, a decades-old betrayal simmers among a group of friends. One returns from serving time for a crime he didn't commit; another, a policeman with ties to the military regime, discovers his wife's infidelity; a third lays dying. And an American missionary has been killed. But what happened among these men? Spinning through a series of voices and timelines, Glaxo reveals a chilling story of four boys who grow up breaking horses and idolizing John Wayne, only to become adults embroiled in illicit romances, government death squads, and, ultimately, murder. Around them, the city falls apart. Both an austere drama and a suspenseful whodunit, Glaxo crackles with tension and mystery. And it marks the stunning English-language debut of a major Latin American writer.

When the wizard's homely assistant Chancery asks a magic book to make him handsome, causing its powers go haywire, he discovers that the only way to remedy the situation is to try to attain his wish without magic assistance.

Revolutionizing Motherhood examines one of the most astonishing human rights movements of recent years. During the Argentine junta's Dirty War against subversives, as tens of thousands were abducted, tortured, and disappeared, a group of women forged the Mothers of the Plaza de Mayo and changed Argentine politics forever. The Mothers began in the 1970s as an informal group of working-class housewives making the rounds of prisons and military barracks in search of their disappeared children. As they realized that both state and church officials were conspiring to withhold information, they started to protest, claiming the administrative center of Argentina the Plaza de Mayo for their center stage. In this volume, Marguerite G. Bouvard traces the history of the Mothers and examines how they have transformed maternity from a passive, domestic role to one of public strength. Bouvard also gives a detailed history of contemporary Argentina, including the military's debacle in the Falklands, the fall of the junta, and the efforts of subsequent governments to reach an accord with the Mothers. Finally, she examines their current agenda and their continuing struggle to bring the murderers of their children to justice.
