The Future of Nursing explores how nurses' roles, responsibilities, and education should change significantly to meet the increased demand for care that will be created by health care reform and to advance improvements in America's increasingly complex health system. At more than

3 million in number, nurses make up the single largest segment of the health care work force. They also spend the greatest amount of time in delivering patient care as a profession. Nurses therefore have valuable insights and unique abilities to contribute as partners with other health care professionals in improving the quality and safety of care as envisioned in the Affordable Care Act (ACA) enacted this year. Nurses should be fully engaged with other health professionals and assume leadership roles in redesigning care in the United States. To ensure its members are well-prepared, the profession should institute residency training for nurses, increase the percentage of nurses who attain a bachelor's degree to 80 percent by 2020, and double the number who pursue doctorates. Furthermore, regulatory and institutional obstacles -- including limits on nurses' scope of practice -- should be removed so that the health system can reap the full benefit of nurses' training, skills, and knowledge in patient care. In this book, the Institute of Medicine makes recommendations for an action-oriented blueprint for the future of nursing.

The Institute of Medicine study Crossing the Quality Chasm (2001) recommended that an interdisciplinary summit be held to further reform of health professions education in order to enhance quality and patient safety. Health

Professions Education: A Bridge to Quality is the follow up to that summit, held in June 2002, where 150 participants across disciplines and occupations developed ideas about how to integrate a core set of competencies into health professions education. These core competencies include patient-centered care, interdisciplinary teams, evidence-based practice, quality improvement, and informatics. This book recommends a mix of approaches to health education improvement, including those related to oversight processes, the training environment, research, public reporting, and leadership. Educators, administrators, and health professionals can use this book to help achieve an approach to education that better prepares clinicians to meet both the needs of patients and the requirements of a changing health care system.

Introduction to Health Care is a college level introductory book for learners entering health care programs or for those that think they may be interested in a career in health care. The content covers a wide variety of topics that are shared by all health care professions. Twenty six chapters are organized into the following nine units: health care today, language of

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health care, human body, personal and workplace safety, behaviors for success, communication, health care skills, business of caring, and securing and maintaining employment. A key feature of this book is its emphasis on teaching learners to develop thinking skills as opposed to simply learning sets of facts. A problem solving model is introduced in Chapter 1 that includes how to assess a situation, consider alternatives, choose an appropriate alternative, evaluate the results, and revise as needed. How to think on the job is continually incorporated into the text. To further reinforce, a recurring element is included called Thinking It Through in which learners must problem-solve workplace examples using the principles found in each chapter. A thinking application problem has been added at the end of each chapter.
