Groups can be excluded based on several characteristics or life circumstances. These include poverty, gender, age, religion, ethnicity and disability, among others. Within a country context, social exclusion implies that excluded groups are not able to fully participate in their country's political, economic, and social life and often are unable to fully benefit from programs and policies intended to benefit the population at large.
