Chapter One introduces sewing tools and machinery (including industrial machines). It discusses how to work with patterns and explains cutting-out methods. Chapter Five addresses fabric-specific techniques, for everything from lace to neoprene. The best technical approaches to use for pattermaking and construction are discussed for each fabric.
