Cottage Detective Record|Field Murder in Wugu Mountain (3)Abandoned Corpses Date: May 28, 2017 Title: Murder in Wugu Mountain (3) Abandoned Corpses Location: Wugu Mountain People: Guo Weiniu, Yan Ruheng, Zhou Zhengxian Case: Guo Weiniu, a field enthusiast, also sells and buys field equipment. Suspected of being deceived and not paying off his long-term debt, he was killed by Yan Ruheng and Zhou Zhengxian. Note: On November 29, 2019, after 18 days of trial, the jury convicted Zhou Zhengxian for murder, and the judge sentenced him to life imprisonment. Yan Ruheng's murder was unsuccessful. Because of "grave negligence", he was unanimously convicted of manslaughter and sentenced to seven and a half years in prison. Guo Weiniu's half-brother Xie Haoyan said in testimony that Guo Weiniu has been interested in field games since the fifth and sixth grades of elementary school. He will spend 70,000 yuan to buy equipment, and have field clothing and supplies. Including national flags and badges, Guo Weiniu also exchanged or resold these supplies. Guo Weiniu was in a conditioning apprentice. His monthly income is only about 10,000 yuan, but he will give seven to eight thousand yuan for home use. On May 27, 2017, Guo Weiniu indicated to Xie Haoyan that he would go hiking and "field fighting". At ten o'clock that night, Guo Weiniu's friend Zhao family entered their residence and was planning to set off together. Xie Haoyan told Guo Weiniu: "I Good wife returns at night and listens to the day's appointment to drink tea." Guo Weiniu, wearing a camouflage shirt, carried a long bag with airsoft guns and left the residence. He did not return home the next morning. Xie Haoyan contacted Guo Weiniu's friends to find him. On May 29, a police officer approached the door and informed Guo Weiniu of his death. He recognized Guo Weiniu's body in the mortuary. Zhao Jiajin (23 years old), who was on an appointment with Guo Weiniu that night, is currently taking an electronic engineering course at the University of Science and Technology. In 2014, I asked Guo Weiniu to help buy helmet clothes, and gradually became familiar through field games. Later, I also met Yan Ruheng and Huang Langqi because of field games. On November 5, Zhao Jiajin continued to testify. He recalled that on the evening of May 27, 2017, Guo Weiniu was wearing a khaki shirt, green camouflage pants and a green camouflage backpack. He took a taxi with Guo Weiniu to the back door of Tseung Kwan O Lingshi Hospital. After getting off the bus, he went uphill to find Yan Ruheng and met Yan Ruheng and Huang Langqi on the way. Everyone walked along Baolin South Road and Ao Jing Road to the Wilson Trail. During a journey through a rock, he and Huang Langqi took a short break. Yan Ruheng said that he would go up the hill with Guo Weiniu to "try out" and ask the two to wait in place. About half an hour later, Yan Ruheng went back alone, panting. He said that Guo Weiniu suddenly received a WhatsApp message and wanted to go downhill immediately. He "pointed to the fastest way to go down the mountain", and Guo Weiniu went down by himself. Zhao Jiajin felt "strange" and called Guo Weiniu, but no one answered the phone. He and Huang Longqi waited for Yan Ruheng to rest and went down together. They packed up in a white gazebo on Ao Jing Road, but he couldn't put his long air gun in his bag. Later, according to Yan Ruheng's suggestion, put the long air gun in Huang Longqi's medical treatment package. Yan Ruheng and Huang Longqi said that they would "go on to other places." Zhao Jiajin went home to rest by himself. On May 28, 2017, a call was received saying that Guo Weiniu's family was looking for him. Zhao Jiajin talked with Guo Weiniu's half-brother Xie Haoyan and met with Xie Haoyan and Guo Weiniu's mother outside the Tseung Kwan O Police Station and entered the police. Report the case and assist in the investigation. When Zhao Jiajin was questioned, he was asked again how long Guo Weiniu and Yan Ruheng had left on the mountain. Zhao Jiajin said that he thought it was about half an hour. Yan Ruheng's representative lawyer said that the time involved was only an estimate and could be wrong. He further pointed out that the two actually left for one to two hours, and Zhao Jiajin agreed. Yan Ruheng's lawyer also asked whether field players who like to wear military uniforms would also use military terms, such as "Night Ops" for Xingshan. Zhao Jiajin said it was unclear. The lawyer then asked: "Take a person down" is a term, Zhao Jiajin replied: "Somewhat, but I can rule it out." On November 6, 2019, the case was reopened in the High Court. There were only two defendants in the case, including the first defendant Yan Ruheng and the second defendant Zhou Zhengxian. The two were charged with the murder of 20-year-old Guo Weiniu in Hong Kong with Huang Langqi on May 28, 2017. Yan Ruheng was also charged with Huang Haohao to delete information stored on the deceased's phone in an attempt to obstruct justice. In the case of the two defendants, Yan Ruheng decided not to testify and did not summon defense witnesses. Zhou Zhengxian chose to defend himself. Daniel, a member of the Midnight Outing Regiment, testified in court that on May 28, 2017, more than ten field group members would meet at Dawokzui Buffalo DGW Magical Takino Battlefield. Li Gengyao, Yan Ruheng and Zhou Zhengxian and a group of six, then went to dinner at Salia in West Kowloon Center. Li Gengyao recalled that Yan Ruheng and Zhou Zhengxian said at the meeting: "Swords and eight sticks" and "Take a long finger with the iron link to the mountain". Other words have now been forgotten. Cai Kangqiao recalled that after he was added to the "Midnight Outing Group" WhatsApp group, the group had agreed to eat at a Japanese restaurant in Mong Kok. Yan Ruheng asked Cai Kangqiao to help him buy sleeping pills because he majored in chemistry. Cai Kangqiao said, "Qu (Yan Ruheng) would like to stun Bosco (Guo Weiniu), and (Yan Ruheng) would like to take a dose of Guo Weiniu." At that time, Cai Kangqiao thought that Yan Ruheng wanted to take the deceased, and inadvertently looked for sleeping pills for Yan Ruheng. Perfunctory said, "I will do so." Cai Kangqiao said that Yan Ruheng had later asked him to purchase sleeping pills with a message. He ignored them. At that time, he did not and had no intention to buy sleeping pills for Yan Ruheng, but he did not refuse Yan Ruheng and kept perfunctory. Cai Kangqiao confessed that he did not know the deceased Guo Weiniu, but learned from friends that the deceased was a field equipment seller and had a bad reputation because of "er money." The defense pointed out that Yan Ruheng's plan at that time was to make Guo Weiniu sleepy with sleeping pills, so that Guo Weiniu admitted that he had defrauded others of money from the transaction. Yan Ruheng also hoped to make a testimony when it was done. Cai Kangqiao said that he did not know the defense's plan. On November 20, 2019, Zhou Zhengxian was originally charged with Huang Jiuhaoh for obstructing judicial impartiality, that is, removing or deleting the data in Guo Weiniu's mobile phone. The judge gave legal guidance to the jury this morning, and the jury ruled that Zhou Zhengxian's crime of obstructing justice was not established. In the afternoon, Zhou Zhengxian said during his self-defense that he played games, field battles, and talked about military information with Guo Weiniu from time to time. He described Guo Weiniu's "sometimes hot character." He knew that Guo Weiniu was buying and selling field equipment, but when he was doing business, he was "sincerely honest." Members of the "midnight outing group" had also traded equipment with Guo Weiniu. Members also thought that Guo Weiniu was "sincerely honest." Zhou Zhengxian recalled that once playing field battles with Zhao Jiajin and Guo Weiniu, Zhao Jiajin saw the belt on him, and Zhou Zhengxian agreed to sell it for three hundred yuan. Zhao Jiajin was short of cash, Zhou Zhengxian handed the belt to Guo Weiniu, and told Zhao Jiajin to find Guo Weiniu to trade when he had cash. Later, he never received any news about the belt. He asked Guo Weiniu. Guo Weiniu claimed that he had handed the belt to Zhao Jiajin, but Zhao Jiajin had not paid. He felt that the situation was different and directly contacted Zhao Jiajin, who said he had paid Guo Weiniu. Zhou Zhengxian confronted Guo Weiniu before the other party admitted that they had collected the money, but because "there was no money in the wild, I saved money to buy it." Zhou Zhengxian recovered money from Guo Weiniu, but the other party owed money under different excuses, including "free time" and "no bank nearby". In the first half of the incident, Zhou Zhengxian and Guo Weiniu had a dispute over buying and selling field equipment. He purchased two wireless walkie-talkies from Guo Weiniu for 38,000 yuan and paid an installment. At the time of the settlement, Guo Weiniu claimed that he had forgotten to bring the battery, and at that time he was unable to test whether the walkie-talkie was operating normally. Zhou Zhengxian later discovered that the walkie-talkie failed, and asked Guo Weiniu to refund or replace the walkie-talkie. The other party insisted that there would be no refund. Zhou Zhengxian said that he would not pay installments any more, so the two of them agreed to confront each other. Zhou Zhengxian stated that Guo Weiniu was threatened during the meeting. If he did not continue to pay installments, he would "put on the Internet" and "sing bad channels" until he lost his job. Zhou Zhengxian informed Yan Ruheng about this and wanted to resolve the dispute through Yan Ruheng's appointment with Guo Weiniu. Yan Ruheng suggested to Guo Weiniu to go to Yeshan or talk about the incident while playing field battles. Zhou Zhengxian said that another member of the "midnight outing group" had suggested "playing Bosco (Guo Weiniu) on the mountain". He did not agree with Yan Ruheng. Later, Yan Ruheng suggested to play tricks on Guo Weiniu, intending to have Guo Weiniu take sleeping pills or alcoholic beverages, which made him recognize "er". Zhou Zhengxian claimed that he did not agree with the approach at that time because he did not know whether Guo Weiniu would be sensitive to the relevant items and "being dangerous on the mountain". Zhou Zhengxian explained that they planned that Yan Ruheng would first go up the mountain that night and use Guo Weiniu to test the equipment on the mountain alone to take Zhou Weixian to the ambush place on the mountain. Yan Ruheng took the opportunity to discuss the transaction dispute with Guo Weiniu. If Guo Weiniu agreed to solve the problem, Zhou Zhengxian would appear to play a "search and rescue game" with them. If Guo Weiniu did not want to resolve the dispute, Yan Ruheng would tie him up, take pictures and film, and Zhou Zhengxian would then show up to discuss with Guo Weiniu. If Guo Weiniu refused to make a film and did not intend to resolve the dispute, Zhou Zhengxian would not show up. Zhou Zhengxian recalled that he took the lead in going up the mountain that night, cooking in the teahouse on the mountain, waiting for Yan Ruheng to bring Guo Weiniu up the mountain. After eating the noodles, he walked to a slightly higher position nearby. When he saw Yan Ruheng and Guo Weiniu walking to the tea pavilion, he moved to the grass near the tea pavilion to overhear the conversation between the two. Hearing Guo Weiniu said: "I don't sell fake ditches." Guo Weiniu suddenly lost his temper. He was worried that Yan Ruheng would be attacked. He walked out of the grass and saw Guo Weiniu pulling Yan Ruheng's collar to beat him. On November 21, 2019, the case was reopened in the High Court, and the second defendant, Zhou Zhengxian, continued to defend himself. He said that after walking out of the grass that day, he saw Guo Weiniu holding Yan Ruheng's collar. He yelled Guo Weiniu to stop his hand. Guo Weiniu rushed forward when he saw him, and said, "Hey, originally you?" He pushed him. Yan Ruheng kept pulling Guo Weiniu in the back and shouted, "Wait, hello." Guo Guonuo ignored it. Zhou Zhengxian said that Guo Weiniu then beat him, and the two began a fight. Zhou Zhengxian said, "Qu (Guo Weiniu) only passed me by force and vigorously." He and Yan Ruheng could not subdue Guo Weiniu, and Guo Weiniu attacked him and Yan Ruheng with different objects, including pistols and air guns. Zhou Zhengxian continued, Guo Weiniu took out a broom and Tietong to attack him at Chashui Pavilion. He snatched Tietong back and hit Guo Weiniu. At this point Yan Ruheng asked him to stop immediately, Guo Weiniu flew at him, riding on him and attacking him. Zhou Zhengxian then snatched Guo Weiniu's weapon and mounted an attack on Guo Weiniu. Guo Weiniu said at the time, "Stop holding the big guy, and fight again." Zhou Zhengxian stopped, looking at Guo Weiniu, and saw Yan Ruheng lying on the ground unconscious. When Yan Ruheng woke up, he went to check Guo Weiniu's condition and found that Guo Weiniu also became unconscious and had blood on his body, but still responding. He told Yan Ruheng to leave first and took his companion Huang Langqi and Zhao's family down the mountain. When he looked at Guo Weiniu's situation again, he found that he had no breath or consciousness. At that time, feeling that Guo Weiniu was dead, afraid and "faced", he wrapped Guo Weiniu's head in a "rice bag" and pulled the body to the terrace. Zhou Zhengxian said that Guo Weiniu was very heavy, and he took off his equipment. When he took Guo Weiniu to the terraces, the imbalance fell with Guo Weiniu into the mountain. After falling down, he ignored Guo Weiniu and climbed by himself. Back to the tea pavilion. Put Guo Weiniu's items in his rucksack, and drop some of Guo Weiniu's equipment, folding knife, iron pass, and pistol down the mountain. He took Guo Weiniu's bag and his backpack down the mountain and walked to Lantian Park. Zhou Zhengxian saw himself in the bathroom of the park, "same body with the same blood," after refreshing, he found a mobile phone in Guo Weiniu's belongings. When he saw that the phone was dirty, he "washed the phone of the Drainage Department." Huang Langqi and Yan Ruheng later went to Lantian Park to find him. In the bathroom, he asked Yan Ruheng to help him conceal what happened on the mountain. Yan Ruheng agreed that when the two separated, Yan Ruheng took away Guo Weiniu's bag. Early in the morning of the day after the incident, Zhou Zhengxian returned home and received a call from Yan Ruheng reminding him to participate in the field activities that day, otherwise it would cause people suspicion. During the event that day, Yan Ruheng said that Guo Weiniu had received some items from a workshop in Kwai Chung. After the event, they went to dinner together. During the period, Yan Ruheng and Huang Langqi received a police call asking them to assist in the investigation. Zhou Zhengxian went to the Kwai Chung workshop to take away Guo Weiniu's items, and discarded them in Mong Kok.

Cottage Investigation Record: Wugu Mountain Field Murder Case (I) Urgent

This book is a critical review of the war on terror from the prism of armed drones and globalization. It is particularly focused on the United States' use of the drones, and the systemic dysfunctions that globalization has caused to international political economy and national security, creating backlash in which the desirability of globalization is not only increasingly questioned, but the resultant discussion about its desirability appears increasingly militating against the international consensus needed to fight the war on terror. To underline the controversial nature of the "war on terror" and the pragmatic weapon (armed drones) fashioned for its prosecution, some of the elements of this controversy have been interwoven in this book. They include, amongst others, the doubts over whether the war should have been declared in the first place because terrorist attacks hardly meet the United Nations' cause belli – an armed attack. There are critics, as highlighted in this book, who believe that the "war on terror" is not an armed conflict properly so called, and, thus, remains only a "law enforcement issue." The United States and all the states taking part in the war on terror are obligated to observe International Humanitarian Law (IHL). It is within this context of IHL that this book approaches the drone as a weapon of aggression, discussing such issues as "personality" and "signature" strikes as well as the implications of the deployment of spies as drone strikers rather than the Defence Department, the members of the U.S. armed forces. This book will be of value to researchers, academics, policymakers, professionals, and students in the fields of security studies, terrorism, the law of armed conflict, international humanitarian law, and international politics.

Yan Ruheng's murder was not established, and he was sentenced to seven and a half years in prison for "grave negligence". May 28, 2017 Batam Saba Facebook Club A question titled [Jianghu urgent! !! !!] Post My friend Bosco Kwok was lost near Lingshi Hospital at 0330 last night. If you know the social casino of Bosco Kwok, please contact the brother and mother of Bosco Kwok as soon as possible. The family members are very worried about him, and I hope friends from all walks of life can help, thank you!
Incident: The four-member squad was on the mountain. Bosco received a call on the way and left the team on his own. There is no news so far. Location: Last night near Lingshi Hospital. Please help share! !! !! Postscript I did not participate in the current hiking activities, the police have reported. This is Bosco Kwok in the Facebook post. His name is Guo Weinuo, 20 years old, an air-conditioning technician apprentice, living with his parents and brother in Anning Garden, Tseung Kwan O. On the night of the disappearance on May 27, 2017, Guo Weinuo had dinner with his family. He wore camouflage uniforms and full field equipment at 11 o'clock in the evening. He told his family to make friends for a field game (war game). , Still not home. His mother asked Guo Weinuo's friends to know that Guo Weinuo and three field fans went to Wugui Mountain to fight fieldwork that night. A fellow friend suggested that Guo Weinuo received a "rescue" at 3:20 am, and left the team to find a way to feed alone and lost the news. Guo Weinuo's family searched for nothing but suspected that he was in danger on his way down the mountain. He may report at 1pm on May 28, 2017. The police then joined the fire and civil security teams in search and rescue. Search and rescue personnel set up a temporary command center in Lantian Park in the evening, and sent a search dog to join the civil security team. They searched overnight in the mountains around Lantian Park, Aojing Road, and Lingshi Hospital. The firefighting, civil security and flight service helicopters searched in Wugui Mountain. Wugui Mountain is about 304 meters high. It is the third section of the Wilson Trail. From Lam Tin to Tseung Kwan O, the main entrance of the Lam Tin section is at O ??King Road and Lam Tin Park. The two entrances are completely stone-leveled, which is convenient for mountain walkers. The mountain road along the way is not rugged, and the nearby dense forests are full of hills. At 3 am on May 29, the firefighting found the blood-stained rucksack belonging to Guo Weinuo in Wugui Mountain and thought it was suspicious. Twenty-nine hours after the disappearance, at 8:24 am on May 29, the searchers fell on the hillside of Mount Guangui towards Lantian Guangtian Village, about three meters from the slope, and found Guo Weinuo wearing camouflage uniform on the corpse ground. . The deceased's dead body took about 45 minutes to reach from the entrance of O King Road, over two hills, and another 40 minutes to walk from Lam Tin Park on the other side. The mountain road is relatively steep. Senior Police Officer of the Regional Crime Unit, East Kowloon, Jiang Zhiquan searched the body of the deceased. The deceased's head was trapped in a white sack and tied up with brown hemp rope. The deceased's trouser pocket contained a black key bag, a blood stained paper, and a brown wallet with an ID card, bank card and cash. Police Constable Deng Qinyu found a black airgun stained with blood while searching. New Territories North Tactical Police officer Liang Xiaomin found a black mirror arm during the search and confirmed that the exhibit had been seized. New Territories North Tactical Police officer Zhou Rongfa found a 15 × 15 cm camouflage bag with blood on the surface during the search operation. East Kowloon Mobile Police Sergeant Wen Guojian, in a search operation, found a dried blood-stained iron pass and a folding knife. Forensic doctor Pan Weiming arrived at the scene and found that the deceased had bruises in various parts of his body. He believed that he had been beaten, suffered head, complications, and had multiple wounds on his face caused by the knife. This caused the wound to be cut and the throat was suspected to be a fatal wound. . The case was classified as a homicide case. The police believed that the deceased was attacked on a mountain trail and then pushed down the mountain. The police blocked the scene of the homicide and were guarded overnight by uniformed police officers. The case was referred to the Second Squad of East Kowloon Region for investigation. Detectives knew that Guo Weinuo was a field enthusiast. When he was seventeen, he became obsessed with field games. When he had spare money, he collected various U.S. special forces' shirts and firearms. Participated in a field game three years ago. About one year ago, I met another group of field enthusiasts because of online shopping. They bought equipment through them, but they were often "stupid". After several transactions, Guo Weinuo discovered that the seller Yan Ruheng (Ma Tian) was deceiving and blamed on the Internet. Yan Ruheng was dissatisfied and threatened to kill Guo Weinuo. The agent believes that the motive may be involved. However, there is another version of the "Stupid" incident. Field enthusiast Tan Jiawei (nickname "MT"), has known Guo Weinuo for nearly eight years and meets every week. He often commissions Guo Weinuo to purchase field equipment. Before the case, Tan Jiawei asked Guo Weinuo to purchase "night vision goggles". Guo Weinuo quoted a price of 35,000 yuan. Tan Jiawei was later introduced by another field friend Zhou Zhengxian and knew Yan Ruheng, a decoration worker. He is a seller of field equipment. Yan Ruheng said that the same "night vision goggles" were available for 31,000 yuan. Tan Jiawei later learned that Guo Weinuo had obtained goods from Yan Ruheng to make a difference. When he questioned Guo Weinuo, the other party denied three times. Tan Jiawei said, "If you are not my Martin (Yan Ruheng), you won't even say it. I asked you three times. Forget it, you." Guo Weinuo responded: "I know I'm too good. I tell you what I know, I'd rather beat you for a meal now." The three who traveled uphill with Guo Weinuo were invited to the police station to assist in the investigation after the incident. The three included Yan Ruheng, Huang Langqi (Cat), and Guo Jianuo's friend Zhao Jiajin. Zhao Jiajin (nicknamed "Zero Five"), who had taken a mechanical course at the Hong Kong Institute of Vocational Education and worked part-time at a field equipment store. He said that Guo Weinuo was looking for him that night, and he had asked Yan Ruheng to fight the field. Be bold! ". The Zhao family entered Guo Weinuo's house to join him and set off together. Zhao Jiajin joined Guo Weinuo, Yan Ruheng, and Huang Langqi together to Wugui Mountain. The road was dark that day, and everyone talked along the way. At about three in the morning, Yan Ruheng suggested that Zhao Jiajin and Huang Langqi sit down and chat at the next rock on the top of Wugui Mountain. Yan Ruheng and Guo Weinuo went to the mountain for a "test run". Half an hour later, the Zhao family saw Yan Ruheng gasping down the mountain alone to meet them. Yan Ruheng told Zhao Jiajin that Guo Weinuo received a telephone message and took an earlier fast path down the mountain and would not return. Yan Ruheng, Huang Langqi and Zhao Jiajin went down the mountain together and broke up at the foot of the mountain. Zhao Jiajin was worried about Guo Weinuo. When he called him, the phone was not connected, and he learned that Guo Weinuo disappeared until Sunday afternoon. Later, he circulated news in social groups. He also assisted his friends on Facebook. Look for. Detectives later found Wu Xinghao, who knew Yan Ruheng and Guo Weinuo at the same time. He was a member of the WhatsApp Group's "midnight outing". Wu Xinghao said that a group of people in the "Midnight Outing Group" had a dinner in mid-April 2017, and he recalled that Guo Weinuo was mentioned in the dinner at that time as "a good wild." Yan Ruheng said to Wu Xinghao: "Have a trip with Bosco to the mountain. Wu Xinghao said that Yan Ruheng and Zhou Zhengxian successfully made an appointment with Guo Weinuo on May 26, 2017. Yan Ruheng said in a collective: "When I isolate him, I will bring him down", meaning Guo When Wei Nuo "places an order", Yan Ruheng will "down" him. After seeing the relevant information, Wu Xinghao thought that Yan Ruheng "would be doing something bad for Guo Weinuo." After the incident, he learned through news reports that Guo Weinuo was killed and killed. The agent asked, "Do you think Yan Ruheng wants to rectify Guo Weinuo?" Wu Xinghao said, "I think it must be a whole thing." After Guo Weinuo's body was delivered to the mortuary, he was examined by a forensic doctor. Forensic doctor Pan Weiming estimated that the deceased died on May 27 or May 28. The cause of death was a head laceration and a large amount of bleeding caused by stab wounds. The deceased Guo Weinuo weighed nearly 90 kilograms. A stab wound to the jaw and complications was found during the autopsy. It is estimated that the deep puncture to the vein caused a large amount of bleeding, the head skin had a laceration, and a 4x3 cm split fracture near the temple. The evidence showed that there was a blood stain on the deceased, weighing 1.1 kilograms of iron pass. The injury of the deceased should be caused by a hard object. The iron pass may cause injuries to the deceased. The bruises and bleeding of the deceased may be caused by punching, kicking or rolling down the hillside, and the head laceration may be caused by a long hard object. Rolling down the hillside does not necessarily cause heavy bleeding in the skull of the deceased, but may cause the deceased to enter a coma. At 7.15 on the morning of May 29, Senior Sergeant Huang Yaoguang of the East Kowloon Regional Crime Squad and plain-clothed police officer arrived at Zhou Zhengxian's house and presented the certificate of appointment. Senior Sergeant Huang Yaoguang arrested Zhou Zhengxian for murder. When he arrested Zhou Zhengxian, he noticed that he was wounded and that the wound was coked. Zhou Zhengxian called under caution: "Sir, I killed Bosco, and I buried my mobile phone on my backpack." Zhou Zhengxian was born in Hong Kong in 1996. He studied at Kwun Tong Government Secondary School until he graduated from Form 6. He was an assistant to the Ferry of the Marine Department before his arrest. He has no criminal record and lives with his parents. Zhou Zhengxian told the agent that the deceased had swallowed the money for selling his belt and sold him the failed radio walkie-talkie. He refused to refund the 3.8 million afterwards. After discussing the two, they decided to go up the mountain in the name of Xing Yeshan, discuss the dispute with the deceased, or rectify the deceased. The deceased attacked on the mountain, and attacked the two with air guns and Tietong. Yan Ruheng snatched the Tietong of the deceased, struck his nose, and beat on the deceased. He stopped until he asked for mercy. Finally found that the dead had died, Zhou Zhengxian told Yan Ruheng to leave, and he would take care of it. It was later confirmed that the dead was Guo Weinuo's phone.
