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El nombre y la figura de Cristo marcan a Iberoamérica. Los primeros españoles y portugueses que llegaron al Nuevo Mundo trajeron esta presencia de lo cristiano, en el siglo dieciséis. El Cristo de la península ibérica llegó tanto mediante la presencia y forma de vida de los conquistadores, como por la prédica de los misioneros que los acompañaron. La centralidad del tema cristológico se explica tanto por la herencia teológica recibida del protestantismo misionero como por la respuesta contextual a la realidad cultural y espiritual de América Latina, un continente nominalmente cristiano. Si el Cristo católico llegó a nosotros vía España, el Cristo del protestantismo ha venido de otros países europeos [como Inglaterra, Francia y Holanda] y de los Estados Unidos de Norteamérica. El Cristo protestante representa la herencia de los reformadores religiosos del siglo XVI, aunque Él no se originó con ellos ni por medio de ellos. Samuel Escobar intenta adentrarse en la comprensión de algunas obras claves de estos diferentes autores como Míguez Bonino, Justo González, Juan A. Mackay y Emilio Núñez, entre otros, que pueden servir como hitos para detectar el itinerario del pensamiento evangélico latinoamericano.

Desde el terreno fértil de la calle Azusa un siglo atrás, el pentecostalismo ha esparcido el fuego del Espíritu Santo a traves del planeta. Hoy, la oposición de los primeros años ha dado lugar a un reciproco y beneficioso dialogo entre los pentecostales y los evangélicos. In the section entitled "Concerning the Service of the Church," the

Book of Common Prayer identifies the normative services of the Episcopal Church: The Holy Eucharist, the principal act of Christian worship on the Lord's Day and other major Feasts, and Daily Morning and Evening Prayer, as set forth in this book, are the regular services appointed for public worship in the Church. (BCP, 13) Eucharistic propers (collects, Scripture readings, and proper prefaces) are provided in the Book of Common Prayer for the days when the Eucharist is the principal service. As celebration of the Eucharist has become more frequent, many congregations and other communities of faith now celebrate weekday Eucharists on days for which the Prayer Book does not assign propers. To facilitate the use of these authorized options, this resource contains weekday propers for the seasons of the Church Year (the temporal cycle), the Common of Saints (the sanctoral cycle), and Various Occasions from the Prayer Book and from resources authorized since the adoption of the Prayer Book. The propers in this resource are grouped into three sections by type for the temporal cycle, the sanctoral cycle, and various occasions. The foundation of our knowledge of God rests upon knowing what he is like. Without understanding God's attributes, we have a skewed perception of him—often one cast in our own image. We need more than just a theoretical knowledge of God in order to worship him as he desires. This classic work of A.W.
