Research is difficult. Even though students are trained in the basic research methodology skills, when confronted with research writing, it feels to them as if they enter a bizarre world, with its own language and conventions, where it is hard to get things right. The book shows how to use the argumentative mindset to approach every important writing challenge. It translates all the necessary skills into jargon-free language using a variety of visuals and simple step-by-step procedures that will enable any person to read the book quickly and start writing immediately. This book offers a much needed alternative to the more traditional texts used to teach writing instruction. But Weaver also offers a realistic remedy. These difficulties are the product not of necessity, but of intelligent choice.
