It is a curiosity that every new visual technology in its infancy seems to gravitate towards erotica and pornography - oil painting on canvas in the 1520s, photography in the 1850s, cinema in the 1900s, the Internet in the 1980s and Second Life in the 2000s. Is it a flagrant demand for attention, a cynical attempt to attract funding, or a real curiosity to see what the greatest attention-puller of all time - sex - will look like in a new visual language? This same-characteristic could be said to apply to the newly enhanced technology of the visual imagination of the 1590s - the printed metal-engraving. And perhaps its major practitioner at that

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time was Hendrik Goltzius, master-printer with a damaged right-hand, whose mastery of the burin was unrivalled across Europe. It helped of course that the current fashion in visual imagery was the mannerist enthusiasm for the nude in every conceivable position, contortion and exhibitionist display that could be imagined. As with all new technologies, the new and often experimental equipment involved was expensive, and the makers had to be persuade, coerce, beg, plead, bribe and fight to find the funding to support it. Goltzius & the Pelican Company is the story of the Dutch engraver Hendrik Goltzius persuading one of the petty German

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princelings of Europe to pay for an expensive printing press to make a limited deluxe edition of a boldly illustrated Old Testament. And like a good advertising executive hoping to clinch a deal Goltzius is prepared to sweeten his offer by getting his Pelican Printing Company from The Hague to fulsomely dramatise six erotic biblical tales that demonstrate the six sexual taboos - voyeurism, incest, adultery, pederasty, prostitution and necrophilia. They start with the very first copulation tutored by Saton on Adam and Eve, and continue with the story of Lot and his daughters, the adultery of David and Bathsheba, the seduction of the under-aged Joseph by Potiphar's Wife, the demonisation

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and disloyalty of Delilah and the humiliation of Samson, finally skipping to the New Testament, to finish with the necrophilic tale of Salome and John the Baptist. Since it is 1590 and Europe is about to plunge into savage and bitter religious wars, tensions are high in the German court striving for liberty of thought, but there is another more insistent and constant perpetual war that never ends, has few truces, no peace conferences and persistent aggression, and this is the never-to-be resolved battle of religion and sex.

Alfred de Musset (1810-1857) was a French dramatist and poet, regarded as one of the first Romantic writers. He was also a prolific novelist of the romantic period and wrote some of the most memorable literary masterpieces of all times. Much influenced by Shakespeare and Schiller, Alfred de Musset wrote the first modern dramas in the French language. His early poems and plays were much appreciated in the French society earning him the reputation of being a dandy. In 1845 he was named a Chevalier of the Legion of Honor. Musset was elected to the French Academy in 1852. Nowadays Musset's

popularity is second only to Racine and Moliere. "My glass is not big, but I drink out of my own glass," he once stated self-consciously. Musset had a profound grasp of the psychology of love and his portraits of women were multidimensional.

diary. Penniless she worked

in cafes, got herself into

the Slade Art School, and

became the first woman to

ever get a BFI grant to make

a film. The book records

both the traumas and the

triumphs of making your way

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in a foreign country, and
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reflects on the powerful

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hold that history exerts on
an individual, and how a new
destiny can be created.

Beautifully written it is a
gem that has been hidden for
a long time. (This is the
first English publication of
the book).

Pardon This Intrusion gathers together 47 pieces by John Clute, some written as long ago as 1985, though most are recent. The

addresses and essays in Part One, "Fantastika in the World Storm", all written in the twenty-first century, reflect upon the dynamic relationship between fantastika - an umbrella term Clute uses to describe science fiction, horror and fantasy - and the world we live in now. Of these pieces, "Next", a contemporary response to 9/11, has not been revised; everything else in Part One has been reworked, sometimes extensively. Parts Two, Three and Four include essays and author studies and introductions to particular works; as they are mostly recent, Clute has felt free to rework them where necessary. The few early pieces - including "Lunch with AJ and the WOMBATS", a

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*response to the Scientology scandal
at the Brighton WorldCon in 1987 -
are unchanged.*

Throughout the world, cultural norms determine a view of women as subordinate to men, and provide a rationale for denial of women's economic and political rights. This collection of essays in the Focus on Gender series explores the issues of cultural traditions and beliefs, and their relation to gender and development. Topics discussed in this book include identity, meaning, and culture; the struggle of feminists from the South to gain legitimacy in Northern-dominated development debates; working to challenge restrictive gender roles in Zimbabwe; gender violence as a

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development issue; the use of rape as a weapon of war in former

Yugoslavia; and the use of popular culture and the media to promote gender equity. Many of the writers recount their personal experiences of cultural constraints on women's freedom of action, and how these can be overcome.
