Marlow takes a job as a riverboat captain with the Company, a Belgian concern organized to trade in the Congo. As he travels to Africa and then up the Congo, Marlow encounters widespread inefficiency and brutality in the Company's stations. The native inhabitants of the region have been forced into the Company's service, and they suffer terribly from overwork and ill treatment at the hands of the Company's agents. **In May, 1890, Joseph Conrad sailed from the French sea-port of Bordeaux for the Congo, thus beginning what one of Conrad's biographers describes as "the most traumatic journey of his life." His experiences in the Congo had a profound effect on him. He himself said that these experiences had changed him for good. "Before the Congo I was just a mere animal"; he told a friend. What he saw in the Congo was subsequently recorded by him in Heart of Darkness, the most terrible of his short stories. (Heart of Darkness is something between a novel and a short story. It may be called a "novella"). Heart of Darkness is a novella written by Polish-born writer Joseph Conrad (born Józef Teodor Konrad Korzeniowski). Before its 1902 publication, it appeared as a three-part series (1899) in *Blackwood's Magazine*. It is widely regarded as a significant work of English literature and part of the Western canon. This highly symbolic story is actually a story within a story, or frame narrative. It follows Marlow as he recounts, from dusk through to late night, his adventure into the Congo to a group of men aboard a ship anchored in the Thames Estuary. The story details an incident when Marlow, an Englishman, took a foreign assignment as a ferry-boat captain, employed by a Belgian trading company. Although the river is never specifically named, readers may assume it is the Congo River, in the Congo Free State, a private colony of King Leopold II. Marlow is employed to transport ivory downriver; however, his more pressing assignment is to return Kurtz, another ivory trader, to civilization in a cover up. Kurtz has a reputation throughout the region. In addition to this book by Joseph Conrad, this version includes additional study guide questions and beautiful illustrations.
