Hi, my name is Ralph Zuranski. Back in 1993, I was a Special Features writer and photographer for the Eagle newspaper, on Coronado island, a small city across the bay from downtown San Diego. Coronado houses two major naval bases: The Naval Amphibious Base, home of the SEALs, and the North Island Naval Air Station. I have a soft spot in my heart for military families. I can relate to the challenges they face because my parents, uncles, and aunts served our country during World War II. My

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Mom and aunt Ann were Air Force flight nurses. My dad was a bombardier in a B-26 bomber squadron, who miraculously survived a crash after a bombing mission in Germany. He retired from the Air Force reserves in 2002 as a Major. My uncle Jerry was a Sergeant in the Army's 42nd Infantry Rainbow Division, who received two Bronze stars in the Battle of the Bulge in Europe. My uncle Casey served with distinction in the Korean War. I have a deep admiration and respect for all the members of the military and their families. As a reporter, I had the opportunity to meet many of our military heroes and the members of their families. Few realize the major sacrifices required by these fathers and mothers who raise their children under very difficult circumstances. In honor of my parents, I created the "In Search of Heroes" program to encourage local high school journalism students to interview individuals they considered heroes. The goal was to help them realize that their family members are the true unsung heroes in their lives. The community leaders in the Rotary Club and Chamber of Commerce, reporters, and videographers at Coronado Cablevision and KNSD TV stations and the principal and teachers at Coronado high school, participated in the "In Search of Heroes" research program. The results were astonishing. Eighty percent of the time, moms were identified as the heroes, who do not get the recognition and rewards

they so richly deserve. They sacrifice their time, talent, physical health, emotional well-being, and treasure to raise their children, especially when the dads are not around. Twenty-five years later, the world has changed. Men, whether married or single, are taking a more proactive role as the primary parent. This is good news! Historically, women were expected to raise children. They were trapped in the Caregiver role. Moms were the pillows and the bandages. Men were the workplace and military warriors who insured their wives and children had food, clothing, shelter, and education. Dads hammered out a living for their family in the cruel, hard, dog-eat-dog business world. Over the last 10 years, there has been a movement towards gender equality. One or both parents may be deployed for many weeks, to military hotspots around the globe or work outside the home. Some men are now choosing to raise their children at home, while the moms are deployed, working full-time or absent from the home. This book will help military families understand the unique challenges they face on a daily basis. When each person realizes they have the potential to be a hero to themselves, then they can accept the tremendous responsibility of being recognized as hero in our society. Most of our military do not consider themselves heroes. When they joined the armed forces, they knew full well that the job was potentially hazardous. Many have been

injured physically and psychologically. It is time we all worked together to help these families heal. Moms, dads, grandmas, grandpas and kids all are heroes, when they reach out to help others without any expectation of a reward. The greatest heroes are those within our own families. Isn't it time we all became heroes to each other and created heroic family units working together to create a better life for everyone. When you understand your unique heroes' journey, it is easier to give and receive help from our family members, friends, community and nation.

soldiers and veterans, die by suicide.
Why? War is violence. There is intent
to cause death, or serious injury, or
threat to the physical and
psychological integrity of others. War
stress is unforgiving. Suicide is an
all too frequent response. Today, one
member of the military dies by suicide
every day. This is a new epidemic. This
book addresses some tough questions:*

What do we know about suicides in the military? Are rates high? Or low? Is military suicide the same or different in the United States and Canada? Is military culture relevant? Do we know the causes, patterns, and associations? Is suicide among the armed forces similar to or different from suicide among civilians? Can it be altruistic? Through individual case studies and general/population approaches, we attempt to understand the cost of military service. It is especially through the personal stories of the great Civil War hero General Emory Upton, Admiral of the Navy Mike Boorda, and Hospital Corpsman Chris Purcell that we find answers. We learn there is a relative lack of understanding about military suicides, mainly due to the very complexity of suicide. The nature of suicide is not monolithic--it is multi-determined. Military service, we find, is a risk factor for suicide and suicidal behavior. Military veterans are twice as likely as civilians to die by suicide. Posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and traumatic brain injury (TBI) are especially noted to be

huge risk factors, but so are other physical and psychological injuries. Sadly, the aftershocks of war include not only suicides but also incarceration, motor vehicle accidents, homicides, homicide(s)-suicides, and many more faces of violence. And there are many more, uncounted, wounded and dead. The families of traumatized soldiers and veterans, too, are indirect victims of their traumatic experience and, for some, their suicides; there is secondary traumatization. Yet, as this book shows, we must not forget that despite the unbearable pain of war, soldiers, veterans, and their military families, including children, are typically resilient. They can survive! Without question, our vulnerable heroes and veterans are at risk for suicide. But there is secrecy surrounding this, which may well be the biggest barrier. The government, the Department of Defense, the military, veterans groups, survivors, health providers, and other stakeholders need to develop and support more research, more programs, and more care for suicidal and disabled

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armed services personnel, veterans, and survivors. This war stress needs to stop.

A teenager during the Battle of Britain, Rod enlisted in the British Army at age seventeen, prepared to fight as an Infantryman in World War II. Following a successful Normandy invasion, Rod planned to join the Allies' rapid advance across Europe. Just weeks into Basic Training, Rod was selected for Commando School, destined to join an elite group of special operations war fighters. Weeks before Rod was due to graduate Commando training, he was mysteriously removed and transported to an airfield. The next day, he participated in the largest Airborne invasion in military history. On September 17, 1944, Rod jumped into Arnhem as part of 'Operation Market Garden, ' an aggressive plan to secure an attack route into Germany through the Netherlands. Despite being wounded as he exited the aircraft, Rod fought in Arnhem for nine

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days in brutal, unthinkable conditions. Surrounded by Germans, 10,000 of Rod's men jumped in, and only 2,000 returned. Demonstrating remarkable courage, led by Lieutenant Colonel John Frost, Rod and his men held the Arnhem Bridge for three days, repelling massive German counterattacks. Finally running out of food, supplies, and ammunition, Frost was wounded, leaving Rod and his men to fend for themselves. For the next six days, Rod fought through brutal urban combat in Arnhem. One of few Arnhem survivors, Rod continued military service through the end of war, to Russia, the Nuremburg Trials, and even the liberation of a German Concentration Camp. Following the war, Rod worked on several top-secret government projects including a real-life flying saucer, as well as the Avro Arrow, one of the most controversial military projects in history. Later, Rod was recruited by General Motors where he developed prototypes for the Corvette project. A very quiet and humble man, Rod has never shared his story. Spanning from childhood to today, with a focus on his World War II service, this is Rod's story. Written by a soldier, for a soldier, author Jeff Wells frames Rod's military experiences within the strategic significance of Operation Market Garden.
