

Jesus Appeals To The World

Definitive biography of Sister Mary Martha Chambon (1841-1907), a nun of the Visitation Order in Chambéry, France who received private revelations from Jesus Christ encouraging devotion to His Sacred Wounds. This study guide introduces gospel of John, also known as the Fourth Gospel, from an ideological perspective. First, Lozada deals with the key historical questions about how we come to understand John's historical identity. Finally Lozada devotes three chapters to key ideological themes in the gospel related to otherness, such as the portrayal of women, the Samaritan woman, and “the Jews.”

This would also be the witness of the good news of the Kingdom of God that Jesus prophesied would be preached to all nations before the end of the world. Once upon a time there was a version of the Christian faith that was practically irresistible. After all, what could be more so than the gospel that Jesus ushered in? Why, then, isn't it the same with Christianity today? Author and pastor Andy Stanley is deeply concerned with the present-day church and its future.
