However, since citizens are often insufficiently informed about public budgets to constructively participate in budget processes one way to empower them and to remove "illiteracy" is to provide budget-literacy education in schools to youth, helping them evolve into civic-minded adults with the essential knowledge needed for analyzing the policy objectives and measures, and the confidence and sense of social responsibility to participate in the oversight of public resources. This book elaborates on appropriate pedagogical strategies and assessment approaches for budget literacy education, and presents lessons that are relevant for the development, improvement, or scaling of such initiatives.
