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behavioral, and communication skills of students. LEGO-based therapy interventions have recently emerged as an effective method for improving social, behavioral, and communication skills for

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children with ASD. Students with ASD are naturally drawn to Legos because of their interest in the designs, bright colors, and organized and predictable nature of the material. This study aimed to

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evaluate the effectiveness of a LEGO-based therapy for children with ASD. Original Lego therapy research from Clinical Psychologist LeGoff (2004) used the Lego-based therapy medium to target

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social and communication skills of students with ASD. The primary research questions supporting this study were as follows: What circumstances led to the implementation of the Lego-

Decades of research have demonstrated

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that the parent-child dyad and the environment of the family"which includes all primary caregivers"are at the foundation of children's well-being and healthy development.

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From birth, children are learning and rely on parents and the other caregivers in their lives to protect and care for them. The impact of parents may never be greater than during the earliest years

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of life, when a child's brain is rapidly developing and when nearly all of her or his experiences are created and shaped by parents and the family environment. Parents help children build

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and refine their knowledge and skills, charting a trajectory for their health and well-being during childhood and beyond. The experience of parenting also impacts parents themselves. For instance, parenting can
