Slumach's Gold chronicles what is possibly Canada's greatest lost-mine story. It searches out the truth behind a Salish man's hanging for murder in 1891 and tracks the intriguing legend about him that grew after his death. It was a legend that turned into a drama of international fascination when Slumach—the hanged criminal—was mysteriously linked to gold nuggets “the size of walnuts.” The stories claimed that Slumach had placed a curse on a hidden motherlode to protect it from interlopers and trespassers just before he plunged to his death “at the wrong end of a five-strand rope.” Although many have attempted to find Slumach's gold over the past 100 years, following tantalizing clues that are part of the legend itself, none have succeeded—or have they? Rick Antonson, Mary Trainer and Brian Antonson have diligently sifted through history and myth, separating fact from

fiction, but leaving the legend intact—along with the promise of gold yet to be found by some future gold seeker. The book presents the historical evolution of gold mining activities in the Egyptian and Nubian Desert (Sudan) from about 4000 BC until the Early Islamic Period (~800–1350 AD), subdivided into the main classical epochs including the Early Dynastic - Old and Middle Kingdoms - New Kingdom (including Kushitic) - Ptolemaic - Roman and Early Islamic. It is illustrated with many informative colour images, maps and drawings. An up to date comprehensive geological introduction gives a general overview on the gold production zones in the Eastern Desert of Egypt and northern (Nubian) Sudan, including the various formation processes of the gold bearing quartz veins mined in these ancient periods. The more than 250 gold production sites presented, are described both, from their archaeological (as far as surface inventory is concerned) and geological environmental conditions, resulting in an evolution scheme of prospection and mining methods within the main periods of mining activities. Arizona Lode Gold Mines and Gold Mining was originally published in 1934 by the Arizona Bureau of Mines Bulletin 137 and covers information on most of the known gold mines in the state of Arizona at the time. A little history is given on the types of Gold Deposits that are formed in Arizona and some Arizona gold mining history. The rest of the book is devoted to the various gold districts in the state. Over 40 Mining Districts and 150 various mines are covered in this book not to mention general claims and areas discussed. If you are looking for gold then the best places to look are near where it has been found before and in Arizona this book will tell you where those locations are along with a little history on the production and geology of each mine. In Rider Haggard's 1885 classic, *King Solomon's Mines*, Allan 'Hunter' Quatermain claims to have found the long-lost mines in southern Africa. But Quatermain was mistaken – leaving the whereabouts of the fabulous gold of Ophir that Solomon used to gild his magnificent golden temple in Jerusalem still shrouded in mystery. Quatermain picks up the trail where Haggard left off, shifting the search for Ophir to the Horn of Africa where the Quatermain's came to believe King Solomon's mines really were. Quatermain's grandson Rider has long been in thrall to the romance of the gold of Ophir and moves in 1906 to Kenya's lawless Northern Frontier District to pick up the trail where his grandfather left off. Ophir he believes was somewhere between northern Kenya and the biblical Land of Punt on the Somali coast. He travels to the holy Moslem city of Harar in north-eastern Ethiopia – the gateway to Punt – where he becomes embroiled in romance of another sort that ultimately ends in tragedy. The story is narrated by Rider's son Alan, who has inherited the Quatermain obsession with finding King Solomon's gold mines. He

The content of gold in the earth's crust is only 0.011 ppm, and it is unevenly distributed, that is, only under special geological conditions can there be gold mines, plus people think that gold is beautiful, so it is cherished by people. In this topic, we introduce gold samples from major gold producing areas, as well as the principles of detecting gold deposits and the formation of gold deposits. The features of this book are: 1. A more comprehensive introduction to the famous and unique gold mines on the earth. This book is undoubtedly a good reference for friends who want to get to know the gold mines. 2. It contains an introduction to the unique gold mines in Taiwan's Jinguashi and Jiufen. This is the first time that gold mines in this place have been fully presented through a book. I would like to thank the Jinjiu mineral collector Zhang Yingjie, Xia Guoxiong old miner, Chen Huosheng old miner and others for

providing specimens and assistance. Let the only remaining orphans in the gold mines here once again give the world a chance to appreciate them. 3. Although some foreign gold mines are not as exaggerated as orphans, they are also extremely rare. Some of them are not in the gallery. They are collected from more than 50 countries, more than 300 mines or places, and thousands of gold mines. The exquisite products selected from the specimens can be said to be beautiful. Taiwan's early textbooks stated that Taiwan lacked metal minerals, and only a small amount of gold and copper was produced in Ruifang. It was not until the autumn of 1991 that my wife and I first visited Jinjiu (Jinguashi and Jiufen are collectively called. Jinjiu is also the area where Ruifang produces gold and copper) that this introduction is very incorrect. At that time, it was not long before the Jinguashi Gold Mine ceased production (1987), and it was in a state of depression. With a feeling of learning and care, I asked the old miners about the relevant knowledge and information about the gold mine. As a result, I found that the old miners only knew how to mine gold, but don't know much about the relevant academic principles. I originally thought that the reports or writings of government agencies and academic institutions could be fully accountable, but the situation was not satisfactory. Since I have been interested in chemistry for a long time, it can be considered a little basic, so I met with the old miners to help solve the mystery of the Jinguashi gold mine. In the next 20 years, as long as there is no work, I rode a

motorcycle from Taoyuan to Jinguashi exploration, and discuss with old miners, nearly 800 round trips. Thirty years have passed, this book is considered complete, and finally the promise of the year has been fulfilled. Lin Chi Chou was born on January 22, 1958, in New Taipei City, Taiwan.
