The presence of God is a theme which can be traced from Genesis to Revelation. God's word reveals a personal loving God who is not aloof from His creation. He is in direct contact with His creation and actively pursues His people. This is reflected by God commanding Moses to "construct a sanctuary for Me, that I may dwell among them" (Ex. 25:8). But why would the God who created the universe want to "dwell among" man? And what does His presence reveal to Israel and to us? God's presence is more than a coincidence: its theological message can be seen from creation all the way through Christ's eternal kingdom.

Therefore, it is the goal of this paper to address a small section of that history; the tabernacle and the temple. This paper hopes to reveal the significance of God's presence in the tabernacle and temple. The presence of God reveals God's relationship to Israel but also God's character, man's sinfulness, and man's need for redemption. The presence of God is also an example of a unifying theme. Yet, there have not been

many comprehensive studies on the subject. Most studies have focused on a specific passage or theme within the Old Testament, but not specifically on God's presence from the inauguration of the tabernacle to the temple. Therefore, the first rationale for this study is to provide a systematic approach to this subject. This paper hopes to give a broader picture of God's presence in the tabernacle and temple. Often scholars have focused so much on one part of God's "tabernacling" that they cannot see the forest because of the trees. The second rationale for this study addresses the purpose for God's "dwelling among" Israel. The Psalmist writes, "The LORD has established His throne in the heavens, And His sovereignty rules overall" (103; 19). If God has "established His throne in the heavens," why would He dwell among men in a tent or a temple which cannot contain Him? This question is at the heart of the unifying theme seen in the Old Testament. It begins in the garden, when the peaceful relationship with God was severed and man was alienated from God. God in His redemptive plan began to pursue His people. This pursuit is seen by God dwelling in the tabernacle and temple. God's presence in the Old Testament foreshadows His pursuit and

redemptive plan in the New Testament. This study endeavors to connect God's presence with God's redemptive plan. God could have revealed this truth solely through written revelation but He chose to give a practical teaching method, which Israel had to live out day to day. God also desired to live among His people and for them to "be a kingdom of priests and a holy nation" (Ex. 19:6). This dwelling characterizes God as a theistic God desiring a relationship with His creation especially His chosen people.
