The examples come from not just the well known artists, but also artists you might not be familiar with. All the images are beautifully reproduced in a large size so the reader can study the different styles and techniques of the different artists. student drawings, helping students gain confidence and gauge their progress. Avoiding unnecessary theory, math, and jargon, they help students develop an intuitive sense of scale and proportion for creating believable perspectives, and offer valuable tricks and shortcuts throughout. In place of lengthy narratives, they support each lesson with supporting video walking through key techniques.
