The Flight of Our Butterfly

Teacher attrition is endemic in education, creating teacher quantity and quality gaps across schools that are often stratified by region and racialized nuance (Cowan et al., 2016; Scafidi et al., 2017). This reality is starkly reflected in South Carolina. Not too long ago, on May 1, 2019, a sea of approximately 10,000 people, dressed in red, convened at the state capital in downtown Columbia, SC (Bowers, 2019b). This statewide teacher walkout was assembled to call for the improvement of teachers' working conditions and the learning conditions of their students. The gathering was the largest display of teacher activism in the history of South Carolina and reflected a trend in a larger wave of teacher walkouts that have rippled across the nation over the last five years. The crowd comprised teachers from across South Carolina, who walked out of their classrooms for the gathering, as well as numerous students, parents, university faculty, and other community members that rallied with teachers in solidarity. Undergirding this walkout and others that took hold across the country is a perennial and pervasive pattern of unfavorable teacher working conditions that have contributed to what some are calling a teacher shortage “crisis” (Chuck, 2019). We have focused our work specifically on the illustrative case of South Carolina, given the extreme teacher staffing challenges the state is facing. Across numerous metrics, the South Carolina teacher shortage has reached critical levels, influenced by teacher recruitment and retention challenges. For instance, the number of teacher education program completers has declined annually, dropping from 2,060 in 2014-15 to 1,642 in the 2018-19 school year. Meanwhile, the number of teachers leaving the teaching field has increased from 4,108.1 to 5,341.3 across that same period (CERRA, 2019). These trends are likely to continue as COVID-19 has put additional pressure on the already fragile teacher labor market. Some of the hardest-to-staff districts are often located in communities with the highest diversity and poverty. To prosper and progress, reformers and public stakeholders must have a vested interest in maintaining full classrooms and strengthening the teaching workforce. An important element of progress towards tackling these longstanding challenges is to gain a comprehensive understanding of the problem. While teacher shortages are occurring nationwide (Garcia & Weiss, 2019), how they manifest regionally is directly influenced by its localized historical context and the evolution of the teaching profession's reputation within a state. Thus, the impetus of this book is to use South Carolina as an illustrative example to discuss the context and evolution that has shaped the status of the teaching profession that has led to a boiling point of mass teacher shortages and the rise of historic teacher walkouts.

Reform of the educational systems in the United States and all over the world are coming from a wide variety of sources – philanthropists and businesses, federal and state governments, administrators and teachers, both large and small school districts. More nimble school districts have the best chance of creating a revised model of educational delivery that will produce successful students. The national statistics are awful. For every 100 low-income students that enter high school, only 65 will get a high school diploma, 53 will enroll in college, and will 11 actually complete a college degree. (Nachazel and Dziuba 2014) And the statistics for students living in poverty are far worse. This is one of many reasons why Roger Cook and the Taylor County Schools are of particular interest. Any district with a 61% poverty rate and over 40% of students attending college and zero (yes, zero) dropouts deserves to be examined.

Canadian teachers are highly qualified, and salary scales in all jurisdictions are typically based on a teacher's level of education and years of experience. While Canada has enjoyed much educational success, the education of First Nations students has historically been one of the country's more controversial and contentious issues. Overall, Canada is a country that is proud of its education system and places a high value on—and participation in—publicly funded education.**

Confucius Institute Stories at Cleveland State University provides an overview of the programs sponsored by the Confucius Institute (CI) at Cleveland State University (CSU). The CI at CSU is located in Cleveland, Ohio, and is a collaboration between CSU and Capital University of Economics and Business (CUEB) in Beijing, China. This book showcases the CI major programs held between 2015 and 2019.This book is divided into three parts. Part One showcases the major academic and cultural programs that CI conducted and was involved in for the university and the community. Academically, CI provided regular classes and lectures in Mandarin Chinese language and Chinese culture. Meanwhile, it also provided teacher training programs to CI and local instructors and teachers. Culturally, CI conducted annual programs and events, including Chinese New Year celebrations, Teacher Appreciation Day (Confucius's Birthday), K-12 Essay and Speech Contests, and the Chinese Bridge Summer Camp for High School Students. In addition, CI also participated in annual CSU and community events including the Asian Festival, One World Day, NBA Cavaliers Chinese New Year celebrations.Part Two showcases the Chinese Bridge Summer Camp for High School Students which is still on-going. The program is designed for qualified local high school students studying Chinese language and culture, and is a collaboration between CI at CSU and CUEB. The students in the program are sent to two cities in China, with one location at CUEB in Beijing. Part Two also showcases what the campers and chaperons learned when they were in China and why they joined this program.Part Three showcases the stories shared by the Chinese instructors and teachers in relation to what they learned in the USA, and the culture shock they overcame during their two or three year experience, while they were teaching at the CSU and local K-12 Schools. It also tells of their friendship with co-workers and community members, and stories of student-teacher collaborations.Finally, in reflection of the bilingual nature of the program. The stories provided are published in Chinese or English in respect to the choice of the author.
