Contrary to the apocalyptic pronouncements of paper media's imminent demise in the digital age, there has been a veritable surge of creative reimaginings of books as bearers of the literary. From typographic experiments (Mark Z. Danielewski's *House of Leaves*, Steven Hall's *The Raw Shark Texts*) to accordion books (Anne Carson's *Nox*), from cut ups (Jonathan Safran Foer's *Tree of Codes*) to collages (Graham Rawle's *Woman's World*), from erasures (Mary Ruefle's *A Little White Shadow*) to mixups (Simon Morris's *The Interpretations of Dreams*), print literature has gone through anything but a slow, inevitable death.
