with different

Leonard Ratner
in the 1980s to
account for
cross-references
between eightee
nth-century
styles and

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genres. While music theorists and critics were busy classifying styles and genres, defining their affects and proper contexts for their usage, composers started crossing the boundaries

between them
and using
stylistic
conventions as
means of
communication
with the
audience. Such
topical mixtures
received
negative
evaluations

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from North-
German critics
but became the

throats'. He does not
want to die, nor,

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indeed, will he. And so, he becomes sovereign. On a level with and against the State.
