In the Shadow of Man

Who – and what – are the Bourgeois? ‘The bourgeois ... Not so long ago, this notion seemed indispensable to social analysis: these days, one might go years without hearing it mentioned. Capitalism is more powerful than ever, but its human embodiment seems to have vanished. I am a member of the bourgeois class, feel myself to be such, and have been brought up on its opinions and ideals,’ wrote Max Weber, in 1895. Who could repeat these words today? Bourgeois opinions and ideals—what are they? Thus begins Franco Moretti’s study of the bourgeois in modern European literature—a major new analysis of the once-dominant culture and its literary decline and fall. Moretti’s gallery of individual portraits is entwined with the analysis of specific keywords—‘useful’ and ‘earnest,’ ‘efficiency,’ ‘influence,’ ‘comfort,’ ‘robs’—and of the formal mutations of the medium of prose. From the ‘working master’ of the opening chapter, through the seriousness of nineteenth-century novels, the conservative hegemony of Victorian Britain, the ‘national malformations’ of the Southern and Eastern periphery, and the radical self-critique of Ibsen’s twelve-play cycle, the book charts the vicissitudes of bourgeois culture, exploring the causes for its historical weakness, and for its current irrelevance.

In Robert Louis Stevenson’s influential novel of mad science and criminal inquiry, attorney Gabriel John Utterson comes to the aid of Dr. Henry Jekyll, an old friend, only to find himself dragged from a world of genial hospitality into London’s foreboding night, which is shrouded in shadows and fog—and stalked by the deranged Edward Hyde. Utterson’s quest for truth is not only a detective story laden with twists, but an intense meditation on man’s inherently dualistic nature, written in a style that often combines disturbing violence with restrained language typical of the Victorian era.

Che cos’è la borghesia? Quando e come si costituisce, quali sono le pratiche attraverso le quali si riconosce, quali le concettualizzazioni che ne interrogano l’identità? E in che modo questa classe sociale, stratificata e differenziata nei secoli, precipita nelle elaborazioni dell’immaginario, nei linguaggi, negli stili e nelle immagini della letteratura? Questo dossier di “materiali per lo studio della borghesia” raccoglie i risultati di un lavoro collettivo di ricognizione e schedatura della bibliografia secondaria sulla borghesia, svoltosi a Napoli in sette indimenticabili pomeriggi dell’autunno 2013. Francesco de Cristofaro e Giovanni Maffei, coordinatori scientifici dell’Opificio di Letteratura reale (promosso dall’Università degli Studi di Napoli Federico II e dalla Fondazione Premio Napoli) hanno dapprima individuato cinquanta testi fondamentali, alcuni dei quali suggeriti dal libro che ha fatto da ‘primo motore’ del progetto, The Bourgeois di Franco Moretti (London – New York, 2013); li hanno poi collocati, in modo approssimativo, in sei campi del sapere (Storia, Filosofia, Sociologia, Antropologia, Letteratura, Linguistica), immaginando per ciascuno due percorsi di approfondimento; infine, hanno previsto un momento introduttivo, intitolato Abbecedario e incentrato in particolare sul rapporto «between History and Literature» – come appunto recita il sottotitolo del volume di Moretti. Al lavoro hanno attivamente partecipato sette équipes ampie e interdisciplinari, composte da docenti, dottori di ricerca e studenti in formazione: tutti uniti da una passione e da un impegno del tutto gratuito. La versione a stampa di Approssimazioni si offre al lettore non solo come uno strumento utile per muoversi all’interno di una questione tematica e teorica di straordinaria complessità e attualità, ma anche come modello operativo per l’allestimento di un qualsivoglia lavoro di ricerca, individuale o collettivo.
