The boy from Queens scored his first hit record in 1957, just months after Elvis Presley ignited the rock era. He kicked off the '80s by reuniting with Garfunkel to perform for half a million New Yorkers in Central Park. Simon has also lived one of the most vibrant lives of modern times: a story replete with tales of Carrie Fisher, Leonard Bernstein, Bob Dylan, Woody Allen, Shelley Duvall, Nelson Mandela, drugs, depression, marriage, divorce, and more. With the help of producer Roy Halee, the album followed a similar musical pattern as their Bookends, partly abandoning their traditional style in favor of a more creative sound, combining rock, R&B, gospel, jazz, World music, pop and other genres. After filming Catch-22, Garfunkel returned and the duo recorded around 14 tracks, three of which were not featured in the album. It was described as both their "most effortless record and their most ambitious." Bridge was released in January 26, 1970 and several re-releases followed. The album was strongly influenced by the earlier work of South African musicians Johnny Clegg and Sipho Mchunu, and the Zulu-Western pop cross-over music realized in their band Juluka.
