As a result of this self-immolation, Montag clearly sees a new truth: "There must be something in books, things we can't imagine..." and perhaps, he thinks, that something can heal not only his life and his marriage, but also his happiness-hunting society. And so Montag begins to read forbidden books that he has hidden in his home, putting his career and life in danger. With the help of Faber, a former professor of literature, Montag seeks a way to help - or force - his society to remember what it has forgotten. With Fire Captain Beatty, the firemen, and their lethal Mechanical Hound in pursuit of him, Montag races against time to save a society unaware that it is heading toward self-destruction.
