Presently in Taiwan, many educational facilities are implementing Task Based Language Teaching (TBLT) approach in an English as a Foreign Language (EFL) and English as a Second Language (ESL) classroom. However, there is a lack of research in Taiwan that examines TBLT to teach conversation skills in an English for Specific Purposes (ESP) classroom. Additionally, with ESP still growing in Taiwan, current research argues that ESP is falling short as many curriculum designs are too generic which results in students failing to demonstrate communicative proficiency in business/professional situations. The purpose of this study is to examine the students' English needs for the workplace and their perception of Task Based Language Teaching (TBLT) and Content Based Instruction (CBI) to teach ESP in a technology company in Taipei, Taiwan. Prior to the course, a Needs Analysis (NA) was conducted through a qualitative method to investigate the students' needs for English in the workplace. After the course, quantitative and qualitative method were used to examine students' perceptions on CBI and TBLT. From the Needs Analysis (NA) findings, students expressed English needs for email writing, travel, meetings, small talk with clients and foreign friends, introducing company products and telephone conversation. After identifying the students' needs, themes and topics were chosen for the ESP course and CBI and TBLT approaches were used to deliver lesson materials. Findings revealed students felt a favorable attitude towards group work in TBLT. Students felt that through group work they had sufficient in-class speaking time which enhanced their English speaking skills and confidence in speaking English. In addition, through interacting with others, they were exposed to a wider range of English vocabulary, sentence structures and ideas. Findings also showed that participants felt that topics and themes for the course were relevant and could be used in the workplace. Nevertheless, the present study also faced several challenges such as the instructor being prohibited from using the mother tongue in class, unable to meet all the students' English needs and some students' were dissatisfied with lesson content. Lastly, based on findings, pedagogical implications are offered for ESP instructors in a similar setting. Keywords: task-based language teaching, English for Specific Purposes, Needs Analysis.

**English for Specific Purposes (ESP) has accumulated substantial tradition in practice, research and theory. It is a common approach in English Language Teaching (ELT) among adults today, starting with high schools, then in academia, pre and in-service training, and life-long learning programs. The role of ESP in each of these is to facilitate work in today's inevitably international business and scientific environment. Only very recently have we begun to witness the occasional but encouraging emergence of ESP academic courses and departments.
