Care and accompaniment for people who are going through critical moments in their illnesses or who are approaching the end of their lives is a noble task full of significance and meaning. Fundamentally it means letting the love, kindness and compassion for the other person, that we all have inside us, be

*expressed correctly and appropriately. Then, when this happens, "accompanying" becomes "art." Personal experience in accompanying many people in the final moments of their physical existence has strengthened me and has reinforced in me the certainty that physical death represents a moment of profound internal transformation and a passage towards a new destination. This certainty has led me to bring together in this work the lessons, tools and practices that have helped me in this task and that I consider to be both well-founded and of great help in caring for and accompanying others. Many people are in the position of caring for and accompany others. Many doubts and questions tend to arise: What is the most appropriate thing to do? What to say, or not say, at any given moment? How to calm the mental anguish that crushes the heart of the person we accompany? How to help "heal" the mental wounds that seem to overwhelm the hearts of those who are departing and of many of their loved ones? How to help reconciliation and intense love spread their wings and transform both life and death? How to spread and radiate the kindness and true compassion that dwell deep within us? This work responds to the individual, inner need to pass on those lessons and practices that have been so good for me and for others. It is an attempt to respond, even if minimally, to some of those questions outlined above. This work is a humble attempt to spread his knowledge where the internal need is present, at the frontier of this life, where human existence takes its final steps to then embark on its new destiny. When I have been able to re-signify the moment of death, it has also re-signified the world of life, bringing me closer to a dimension where inner peace, agreement with myself and a very gentle joy springs up within me. In those moments, a deep understanding of the meaning of human existence and the certainty of spiritual transcendence are present.*

This book is an edition, with commentary, of Handel's exercises for continuo playing, which he wrote for the daughters of George II. The exercises, which until now have not been readily available, are supplemented by clear and concise commentary. Remaining faithful to his source, Ledbetter, who lectures in keyboard studies, has prepared an edition that will prove invaluable to students and performers of the music of Handel and his contemporaries.

This is a concrete, practical book about spiritual accompaniment.

While there may be no shortage of books on this matter, most of these books remain somewhat abstract in the way they highlight the beauty of this ministry and point out its pitfalls. This book instead resembles a toolbox with a user's manual. In six chapters, the author presents the following tools: 'there is no rush', 'listening by following', 'searching for the soul', 'going deeper', 'evaluating', and 'accompanying towards spiritual maturity'. By means of examples and case studies, he demonstrates how these tools may be used to good effect. Two introductory chapters discuss the choice for a practice-oriented book and the core values of an Ignatian approach to spiritual accompaniment. A final chapter specifically focuses on vocational discernment. New spiritual directors can learn from this book the tricks of the trade and experienced directors can be encouraged to reflect upon their own practice. Although it is written from a Roman Catholic, Jesuit background, this book may be used in a wider variety of Christian contexts.

*In this culmination of his search for anthropological concepts and*

practices appropriate to the twenty-first century, Paul Rabinow contends that to make sense of the contemporary anthropologists must invent new forms of inquiry. He begins with an extended rumination on what he gained from two of his formative mentors: Michel Foucault and Clifford Geertz. Reflecting on their lives as teachers and thinkers, as well as human beings, he poses questions about their critical limitations, unfulfilled hopes, and the lessons he learned from and with them. This spirit of collaboration animates *The Accompaniment*, as Rabinow assesses the last ten years of his career, largely spent engaging in a series of intensive experiments in collaborative research and often focused on cutting-edge work in synthetic biology. He candidly details the successes and failures of shifting his teaching practice away from individual projects, placing greater emphasis on participation over observation in research, and designing and using websites as a venue for collaboration. Analyzing these endeavors alongside his efforts to apply an anthropological lens to the natural sciences, Rabinow lays the foundation for an ethically grounded anthropology ready and able to face the challenges of our contemporary world.

Johann David Heinichen (1683-1729) was a distinguished composer, a contemporary of Johann Sebastian Bach, and Cappellmeister at the court of August I in Dresden. His treatise, *Der General-Bass in der Composition*, is one of the most comprehensive sources for the late Baroque practice of figured-bass, or thorough-bass, accompaniment. It is a fund of information about many complex problems confronting musicians in the performance and interpretation of Baroque music, including meters, embellishments, dissonance, particular complications for recitative, and use of the figured bass. With a judicious combination of translation, interpretation, and commentary George J. Buelow makes Heinichen's famous treatise accessible for contemporary scholars and performers. Buelow provides translations of key sections of the treatise, explains its historical significance, clarifies Heinichen's obscurities, and relates the treatise to other musical theories and practices of the Baroque, including those of Gasparini, Mattheson, and the Bachs. Buelow, one of the world's premier experts on Baroque music, is a professor of musicology at Indiana University.
