Lyric Incarnate examines the plays of Aleksandr Blok, the pre-eminent poet of Russian Symbolism and one of the greatest poets of the twentieth century. Blok's plays have received less attention than his poetry in the West, and this book is the first and only English-language monograph devoted to Blok the playwright. In chronological succession, each of Blok's major plays is examined in detail. Special attention is accorded to Blok's relations with the major directors of his time, particularly Meyerhold and Stanislavsky. Blok's role, for instance, in Meyerhold's formulation of the theatre of the grotesque proved to be critical, and his relation to the Moscow Art Theatre just before the October Revolution helped to define the future course of that theatre. Blok's innovative dramatic technique is carefully studied at each stage in his career, from his earliest "lyric dramas" , such as A Puppet Show and The

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Stranger, to his great tragedy The Rose and the Cross.

Introduction by George Woodcock This precious work, which first appeared in the Atlantic Monthly, was published in book form in 1899. Having delighted readers as varied as Leo Tolstoy and Lewis Mumford, Memoirs continues to be a classic in this literary genre. Peter Alexeivich Kropotkin (1842-1921) was born into the highest rank of the Russian aristocracy. This fascinating account of his dramatic conversion from prince to anarchist is more than an autobiography; it is an extraordinary portrait of the old Russia, both before and after the liberation of the serfs. Kropotkin was a remarkable writer in the Russian tradition, and this work stands as a non-fictional counterpart of the novels in which Turgenev and other great Russian writers portray the development of social conscience among the youth in autocratic society. Having renounced his title, Kropotkin pursued his work as a scientist and won international acclaim as a geographer as well as a radical. Memoirs is also a study of the early anarchist movement in Western Europe, in which Kropotkin played a part after his escape from a Russian prison - thereby earning a second imprisonment, this time in France. John Beverley Robinson (1791–1863) was one of Upper Canada's foremost jurists, a dominating influence on the ruling élite, a leading citizen of nineteenth-century Toronto who owned a vast tract of land on which Osgoode Hall now stands. The loyalist a colony firm in its devotion to the Crown, with little room for dissent. As a true loyalist son, educated by John Strachan, Rob attempted to steer Upper Canada toward emulation of what he perceived to be Britain's ideal aristocratic society. Robinson was appointed chief justice in 1829, and his judicial career spanned thirty years, during which he insisted the courts were subservient to the legislature and established precedents declaring their role limited to the enforcement of existing laws, with no independent creative function. His long service on the bench represented preservation and a strengthening of the British tradition in Canadian law. In this biography, early Toronto comes alive through

a powerful man—firm in his beliefs, attractive to women, respected by his fellows—who sought to mould society to his own historians, lawyers, and students of jurisprudence who seek an understanding of the roots of legal practice in nineteenth-century America is essential reading.
