We live in a time of great uncertainty about the future. Those heady days of the late twentieth

century, when the end of the Cold War seemed to be ushering in a new and more optimistic age, now seem like a distant memory. The physiologist Benjamin Libet famously demonstrated that activity in the brain's motor regions can be detected some 300 milliseconds before a person feels that he has decided to move. Clearly, findings of this kind are difficult to reconcile with the sense that one is the conscious source of one's actions. The question of free will is no mere curio of philosophy seminars. A belief in free will underwrites both the religious notion of "sin" and our enduring commitment to retributive
