In October 1928 Virginia Woolf was asked to deliver speeches at Newnham and Girton Colleges on the subject of ‘Women and Fiction’; she spoke about her conviction that ‘a woman must have money and a room of her own if she is to write fiction’. The following year, the two speeches were published as A Room of One’s Own, and became one of the foremost feminist texts. Knitted into a polished argument are several threads of great importance – women and learning, writing and poverty – which helped to establish much of feminist thought on the importance of education and money for women’s independence. This book studies the tension between historicity and the desire to free the subject from historical necessity that defines novels that are presented as if they were the autobiographies of historical personages, novels that gesture towards historical factuality and literary fictionality.

Boldrini visits autobiographies of others, or 'heterobiographies,' that are distinguished by the acknowledgment in their fictional structure and ideological premises of the operation involved in assuming another’s voice, of the historical and philosophical gap inherent in the ‘double I’ they stage. Unlike more traditional examples of the historical/biographical novel, their aim is not so much the reconstruction of a historically believable context and individual, but the very exploration of that gap: of changing conceptions of selfhood; of the relationships between writing, history, and subjectivity; and of the intellectual categories that shape our understanding of these relationships. The analysis of texts by authors such as David Malouf, Peter Carey, Michael Ondaatje, Gilbert Adair, Anna Banti, and Manuel Vázquez Montalbán shows that heterobiography is a powerful literary and intellectual tool employed to reflect critically on cultural, historical, and philosophical constructions of the human; on individual identity, its representations, and its formation through dialogue with the other; on the relationships of power that define the subject socially and legally; of the ethics of the voice and the ethical implications of literary practices of representation; and, therefore, also on the social, political, and cultural role of the literary writer.

This is a landmark anthology of international feminist theatre research. A three-part structure orientates readers through Cartographies of feminist critical navigations of the global arena; the staging of feminist interventions in a range of international contexts; and Manifestos for today’s feminist practitioners, activists and academics.

Virginia Woolf. The third chapter of Woolf’s essay “A Room of One’s Own,” based on two lectures the author gave to female students at Cambridge in 1928 on the topic of women and fiction. 36 pages. Tale Blazers.

L’adolescenza è sempre stata vista come un’ et à problematica, portatrice di conflitti a volte violenti e difficilmente governabili. Al Centro Milanese di Psicoanalisi si è costituito da molti anni un gruppo di analisti interessati a prendere privatamente in cura adolescenti con difficoltà economiche, collocati in comunit à o provenienti da famiglie multiproblematiche. Il gruppo si pone come obiettivo la ricerca. Una ricerca che parte dalla necessit à di uscire dal territorio “classico” e avventurarsi in un territorio impervio e sconosciuto “alla periferia dell’ analizabile”, ma ricco di aperture su nuovi scenari. In tale contesto la competenza psicoanalitica pu ò essere spinta verso nuove declinazioni. Questa esplorazione di frontiera ha ricadute importanti sulla tecnica dell’ analisi, non solo degli adolescenti. È di Giuseppe Pellizzari l’ idea originaria di pubblicare sotto forma di manuale i frutti del lavoro del gruppo da lui voluto e a lungo coordinato, per proporre quello che si è imparato, rendendolo fruibile, grazie ai numerosi esempi clinici, per tutti gli operatori che, specie nelle strutture pubbliche, si trovano a fronteggiare quella che appare come un’ emergenza difficile e complessa. Nello stesso tempo è parso opportuno proporre anche le problematiche tecniche e teoriche che si incontrano inoltrandosi in questi territori periferici e marginali, ma tali da costituire il futuro della psicoanalisi stessa.

**In recent years, the interest in the house has grown irresistibly, to the point that in many ways houses seem to be situated at the very core of the creative, artistic and cultural domains of contemporaneity. Their presence sprawls across the media, from magazines to TV programmes, and across the globe, possibly because as repositories of the human, houses have a long-standing and profound connection not only with men and women but, at a deeper level, with the ways of representing man’s world, across its declinations of gender, class, and race. Houses - the perennial, ubiquitous and silent background to our daily lives - could many “a tale unfold”: the tales of their inhabitants and/in their relationships with others, of the times they lived in, of their configurations of the world, as well as the visions (and nightmares) of the artists who created them. This collection offers a comprehensive and transdisciplinary look at the paper houses of English Literature in the eighteenth and nineteenth century. Among the configurations addressed, the authors investigate the domestic spatialization of authority, gendered houses, narratives of household construction and deconstruction, exotic mansions, fin-de-siècle habitats, haunted edifices, and houses in detective and Gothic fiction. This collection of essays surveys some of the artistic productions by female figures who stood at the forefront of Italian modernity in the fields of literature, photography, and even the theatre, in order to explore how artistic engagement in women informed their views on, and reactions to the challenges of a changing society and a ‘disinhibiting’ intellectual landscape. However, one other objective takes on a central role in this volume: that of opening a window on the re-definition of the subjectivity of the self that occurred during an intriguing and still not fully studied period of artistic and societal changes. In particular, the present volume aims to define a female Italian Modernism which can be seen as complementary, and not necessarily in opposition, to its male counterpart.**

Con il marito fondò nel 1917 la casa editrice Hogarth Press. Grande estimatrice dell’opera di Proust, divenne presto uno dei nomi più rilevanti della narrativa inglese del primo Novecento. Morì suicida nel 1941. La Newton Compton ha pubblicato Gita al faro, Una stanza tutta per sé, Mrs Dalloway, Orlando, Notte e giorno, La crociera, Tutti i racconti e il volume unico Tutti i romanzi.
